"There is no question, this was a big win for us," said Norton head girls coach Kevin Jilka. "Our girls played hard all night long and deserved to win. We held them to just 22 percent shooting from the field and that is just a tremendous effort.

"Offensively, we did a good job of executing but just didn't shoot well from the perimeter despite having great looks all night long.

Having little success shooting from the perimeter, Norton went inside to Bozarth the next three quarters and she responded with 18 more points. Bozarth hit four baskets and a free throw in the second quarter. Ashlie Stewart hit one basket and Baird connected on two free throws.

nortontelegram@nwkansas.com The No.7 seeded Norton Community High School boys basketball team outscored No.6 seeded Ellis in two of the four quarters when they played at Ellis on Thursday evening in the consolation semi-finals of the Mid-Continent League Tournament but the game ended with the Blue Jays on the losing end of a 46-37 score.

"This is the best we have played for a complete game," said Norton head coach Doug Reusink.

"We still struggled at times putting the ball in the basket and didn't finish our defensive effort with rebounds but, overall, we played well.

"We overcame some adversity with Landon Hamel out with sickness and Dakota Dreher still out nursing a knee.

"We started two freshmen, Jordan Wahlmeier and Tye Nickell, and they stepped in and did a nice job along with the rest of our bench."

With two baskets each by Zac

Draper, Norton led 11-8 after the feeding Matt Erbert, their 6'3", first quarter.

A 15-4 second quarter by the home team put the Jays behind 23-15 at halftime. Norton's only baskets in that period came on two shots by Dreher.

The Blue Jays battled the Railroaders hard in the third quarter where they outscored Ellis 12-10 but still trailed 33-27 with one period remaining. Norton's third quarter points came on threepoint baskets by J.D. Gall and Nickell, a basket and free throw by Wahlmeier, another basket by Dreher and a free throw by Marcus Herman.

In the fourth quarter, Dreher hit a free throw and Gall stole the ball and drove for two more Norton points to cut the Ellis lead to 36-30 with 5:31 left. Dreher swished a two-point basket to reduce the margin to four points at 36-32. After Ellis scored again, Draper matched it with a Norton basket on the other end to make it 38-34 with 3:39 remaining.

After Ellis hit another free


