Have you ever wondered what things women carry in their purses? If so, you will see some evidence in the current displays shared by Ada Arfrod at the Norton Public Library.

Ada's display, Women's Purses and Their Contents, was inspired by a traveling exhibit at the Dane Hansen Museum in the summer of 2008.

Purses, dating from the 1800's through recent times, are a part of the display.

Some are handmade, but most are store bought items. Purse styles have changed with fashion.

Materials can be about anything depending on imagination and use—aluminum pop tabs, fabric, reptile skins, leather, beads or straw.

Basic styles include bags with handles, those with shoulder straps and small clutch styles.

Purse contents run the gamut from the necessary such as money, makeup, handkerchiefs to the frivolous such as a cigarette holder.

One display case includes smoking accessories—match books, cigarette lighters and cigarette cases.

Vanity items—comb, brush, hair pens and ornaments, rouge, lipstick, powder containers and compacts might be found in a purse.

Small perfume bottles or perfume samples might also be important items. The finest piece in this collection is a monogrammed Elgin purse/compact in a black carrying case.

There was a time, before Kleenex, when handkerchiefs were both useful and decorative.

Check out the variety Ada has displayed. Head scarves were a must too. Like hankies, many are souvenirs today.
