Stay home

If you have some of the above symptoms:

• Stay at home, get plenty of rest, drink fluids and take fever reducers such as acetaminophen or ibuprofen.

• Avoid contact with others.

• Wash your hands often with soap and water, especially after you cough or sneeze. Alcohol-based hand cleaners are also effective.

• If you must leave the house to seek medical care, wear a facemask.
