

Conservation Reserve issues annual reminder

Conservation Reserve Program participants are responsible to maintain Conservation Reserve Program cover maintenance. The maximum payment rate calculation considers the cost of the maintenance for the participant throughout the Conservation Reserve Program Contract period. The Natural Resource Conservation Service has worked with Conservation Reserve Program Participants to plan maintenance practices, such as mowing, spraying, or prescribed burning in a logical and practical manner. All practices necessary for the

successful establishment and maintenance of the approved cover were included in the conservation plan and agreed to by the Conservation Reserve Program participant. For a Conservation Reserve Program Contract where a maintenance plan was not scheduled, the conservation plan shall be modified to include appropriate maintenance.

Note that many of Conservation Reserve Program acres have shown some noxious weeds. Discuss any noxious weed problems with the Weed District to insure control. Conservation Re-

serve Program participants shall receive Farm Service Agency County Committee approval before beginning spot treatment of acreage. The Farm Service Agency County Committee shall approve a method of treatment that results in the least amount of damage to the nesting wildlife and habitat and is limited to the immediate area of infestation. "After we did all that, we're still down to furlough days," Morel said.

The new order, handed down by the court on March 12 and signed by Justice Nuss, details the days of involuntary unpaid

days as Fridays April 9, 16, 23 and May 7, unless otherwise approved in advance in writing by the Supreme Court.

Nuss said, "while forced leave was unavoidable, the judiciary tried to minimize the lost income for their employees."

Critical needs include criminal issues, child in need of care/juvenile offender, care and treatment,

protection from abuse orders and other miscellaneous hearings concerning temporary orders or those of an emergency nature.

"There will be no new cases filed unless there is an emergency. The third floor (of the courthouse) will basically be closed. We'll be available for emergencies," Anderson said.

(Continued from Page 1) greater efficiency in government also increases, particularly in rural areas of the state," said Norton City/County Economic Development Director Diane Stiles.

Stiles said projects such as a joint law enforcement center

could be considered but would have to be approved by voters.

"Partnerships between Norton County and the cities within, as well as with other counties in the region, will result in more innovative approaches to delivering government services," Stiles said.

Pinegar, Smith and Associates was the consulting firm hired for the Promoting Norton County Initiative.

Stiles said they took SB 463 on pro bono.
