• Adopted the setting of a special meeting on Aug. 23 at 5:30 p.m. for the purpose of setting goals; 2011-04 Annual Waiver of the Generally Accepted Accounting Principals and Fixed Asset Account as presented.

• Passed a resolution authorizing the early payment of bills and reimbursements as presented,

• Authorizing the transfer of funds among Norton Community Schools accounts.

• Appointed April Karnopp as the board representative to the NCKSEC Board of Directors.

• Appointed Craig Renner as the board representative on the Professional Development Council for the 2010-'11 school year.

• Appointed Scott Ellis as the board representative to the Curriculum Coordinating Council.

• Appointed Jennifer Boller as the board representative on the KASB Governmental Relation Board.

• Continued the annual alternation of the district's checking account between the First State Bank and The First Security Bank and Trust and located the checking account with First State Bank for 2010-'11.

• Continued investing idle funds

in accordance with current Board of Education policy B705, K.S.A. #12-1675 as amended and annotated and past practice.

• Approved the district credit cards, uses and limits as amended for 2010-'11.

• Directed the superintendent to increase the mill levy for the Local Option Budget by 4 mills over what was presented.

• Directed the Board of Education clerk to publish the budget as amended, pending review by KSDE and to set the budget hearing for Aug. 12 at 7:30 p.m. in the Board of Education meeting room at the Norton Unified School office.

• Continued membership in Schools for Fair Funding for 2010-2011 at a cost of \$2,956.88.

• Ratified the agreement with the Norton Teachers Association which grants an increase of 2.5 percent for 2010-'11 with a \$10 increase in the contribution from the board toward the Blue Cross Blue Shield premium making the total health insurance contribution \$333 per month.

• Increased all administrators wages by 2.5 percent and classified staff wages by 2.5 percent or 25 cents per hour, whichever is greatest, for the 2010-'11 school year and increase the board's contribution toward Blue Cross and Blue Shield by \$10 to \$335 for classified staff and continue to provide a plan A single plan for administrators.

• Gave permission to sell by sealed bid a surplus piano and Ford tractor.
