Road Construction begins

Kansas Department of Transportation will begin work to re-pave US-24 and US-283 Highways in Graham County.

The first phase of work will begin on US-24 at the east city limits of Hill City, extending east approximately eight miles to the junction of K-18. Workers will mill two inches of existing pavement; and overlay the same section of roadway with two-inches of new asphalt material.

The second phase of construction takes place on US-283 Highway. This project starts approximately three miles north of the Trego County line, and extends north 13 miles to the US-24 junc-

Beginning Tuesday, June 14, the tion. It involves a one inch mill portation awarded the construcfollowed by a three-inch overlay.

"It is very unlikely that the contractors will be working on both sections of roadway at the same time," said District Three Construction Engineer Travis Scott.

Flaggers and a pilot car operation will guide one-lane traffic 2010. through both work zones during daylight hours. Delays of 15 minutes or less will be expected throughout the construction time




