"The Hays people and that includes the community, the local Shriners and Fort Hays State, have made it very clear that they love to host our game," he said. "They have rolled out the red carpet each time we've been there and it was an easy decision to award the game to Hays based on how helpful they've been on previous visits."

The Shrine Bowl has been good to the West squad, winning both "home" games by scores of 21-17 in 1997 and 26-7 in 2007. The West owns a 23-13 series lead and has won a Shrine Bowl record five straight games. The last East team to celebrate a win was the 2005 squad, which won 17-10 in Manhattan. That team was led by then-quarterback Kerry Meier of Pittsburg, who became a wide receiver at the University of Kansas and will begin his second year in the NFL with the Atlanta Falcons this fall.

One of top players

Norton's Terrell Lane was chosen for the prestigious Shrine Bowl All-Star Football Game by vote of the Kansas news media.

A four-year letterman for the Blue Jays, the shifty, hard-running Terrell has received All-Mid-Continent League recognition all four years, as well. He was a unanimous selection by league coaches this season.

Terrell was also a first team choice in Class 3A by the large daily newspapers as well as the Kansas High School Football Coaches Association.

He had a super senior season for the 9-1 Blue Jays. He rushed for 1,768 yards on 148 carries for an average of 11.95 yards per carry and rushed for 26 touchdowns. This season, he gained 2,278 all-purpose yards since he returned punts and kickoffs.

During his four-year career, Terrell ran for 5,011 yards and rushed for 59 touchdowns!

He has signed a letter of intent to play football this fall for Hutchinson Community College.

Terrell is the son of Heidi Lane Davis, grandson of Patty Fisher and great-grandson of Lila Fisher.

Players for the West squad will include: Reggie Jordan, Hill City, quarterback, defensive back; Josh Nixon, Smith Center, offensive and defensive lineman; Ron Baker, Scott City, quarterback, safety; Derek Racette, Hutchinson Trinity, quarterback, defensive back.

Head coach of the West team is Rick Wheeler, Wichita Heights. His assistant coaches are Brian Hill, Garden City; Dan Adelhardt, Kapaun-Mt. Carmel; Jeff Geist, Abilene; Sean Racette, Trinity and Brett Kendrick, Stanton County.

One of the assistant coaches for the East team is Brooks Barta, head coach at Holton and former star player for Smith Center

High School and Kansas State University.

income from within Kansas.

If new residents meet the criteria, the incentive comes in the form of tax rebates where the citizens pay their taxes as usual, but are issued a state refund for what they pay.

A second part of the Rural Opportunity Zone legislation is an opportunity for counties to encourage population growth through a student loan repayment program. Sproul explained that counties can opt to pay a portion of student loans for students or graduates who move into the county from out of state. The state has set aside \$1.3 million for the program and will match financial contributions from
