Final race of the season at **Elmwood Park Speedway**

Elmwood Park Speedway in Norton, KS, wound up the regular season Saturday evening, August 20.

Hometown driver Kelly Karnopp drove by Anthony Martin on lap 2 of the 8-lap IMCA Hobby Stock feature to drive away and pick up his fifth feature win and another track championship at his hometown track. Martin finished second. Karnopp also won the heat race.

The IMCA Stock Car division also wrapped up their season on the one-half mile oval which saw heat race winner Bob Rutherford lead the field the first 10 laps of the 12-lap race before Logan's Dustin McClurg took the lead and held on to the checkers for his second victory at Norton this season. Rutherford finished second, and Jason

Davis' third place finish gave him the point title at his hometown track for 2011. John Annon and Chase Conaway completed the top five.

The IMCA Sport Mod feature had a wild finish. Heat race victor Ben Hobbs took the early lead and looked to have things well in hand. Then on lap 10, point leader Brian Conness of WaKeeney passed Hobbs in turn four, but contact was made, sending Conness spinning and bringing out the only caution during the four feature races. Hobbs was sent to the back for contact, and Conness led the field back to green for a greenwhite-checkered finish. Conness was first to the checkers for his fourth victory at Norton this season. Hobbs charged from the back on the restart to take second, followed by Dan Lauer

and Jason McCartney.

Darren Berry of McCook led all 12 laps of the IMCA 305 Sprint Car feature to make his third trip to the winner's circle at Elmwood Park Speedway. Tommy Williams, Randy Bantam, Troy Edwards and Greg Reiners completed the top five. Berry also won the heat race.

The 2011 season at Elmwood Park Speedway wraps up on Saturday & Sunday, September 3-4. The URSS 305 Sprint Cars will be on hand both days. They will be joined by the IMCA Sport Mods and vintage cars. Race time is 7:00 p.m. each evening. At the conclusion of the Sunday program, track champions will be crowned in both the sprint car and sport mod classes.

The State of Kansas Sports Hall of Fame announces honorees

The State of Kansas Sports Hall of Fame has announced the 50th Anniversary Class of 2011 who will be enshrined in ceremonies on October 2 at the Kansas Sports Hall of Fame in the Wichita Boathouse.

The members of the KSHOF Class of 2011 are: Marysville's Kansas State University All-American basketball player Kendra Wecker, K-State All-American linebacker, Mark Simoneau of Smith Center, Kansas University All-American basketball player Raef LaFrentz, former Emporia State track star John Camien, former University of Kansas athletic director Bob Frederick, University of Kansas basketball coach Dick Harp, Wichita State All-American baseball pitcher Don Heinkel, Wichita State football coach Willie Jeffries and Pittsburg State football All-American Ronnie West. Frederick and Harp will be inducted posthu-

The induction ceremony will be held on Sunday, October 2 in Wichita. The nine-person class raised the total of inductees to 210 in the Kansas Sports Hall of Fame, which is celebrating its 50th anniversary this year.

Kendra Wecker

Marysville's Wecker was a three-time first-team All-Big 12 Conference selection at K-State, Big 12 Player of the Year

and consensus first-team All-American in 2005. She played from 2002-05 and ranks No.1 in points scored (2,333) and rebounds (1,087). Wecker averaged 18.2 points and 8.5 rebounds a game for her career and her No. 53 was retired by K-State in 2005.

A three-time consensus first team all-state selection at Marysville High School, Wecker scored 2,305 points and grabbed 1,051 rebounds, becoming the first Kansas female prep player to accomplish the 2000/1000 feat. In 2001, she was named "Miss Kansas Basketball" by the Kansas Basketball Coaches Association and the Kansas Player of the Year by the Kansas Sports Hall of Fame.

In track and field, she set the national high school record in the javelin and was a threetime state champion. Kendra was also a first team All-State volleyball player and won the national Punt, Pass and Kick competition as a middle school student. Wecker's athletic stardom in every sport has earned for her the reputation as Kansas' greatest all-around female athlete. She was also a three-time first team Academic All-Big 12

Mark Simoneau

Simoneau, a consensus first team All-State football star from Smith Center, was one of the best linebackers ever to play at Kansas State. He played for the Wildcats from 1996-99 and currently ranks No.3 all-time in tackles (400) and in tackles for losses. He played in four bowl games for K-State and led the team in tackles as a junior and

In 1999, Simoneau was named first-team All-American, the Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year and the runner-up for the Butkus Award. He was also named the Big 12 Defensive Freshman of the Year in 1996.

Jeff played 10 seasons in the National Football League for Atlanta, Philladelphia and New Orleans and had 370 tackles. He was also the state 3A shot put champion at Smith Center in 1995 with a mark of over 60

Raef LaFrentz

LaFrentz was a two-time consensus first team All-American basketball player at the University of Kansas, Big 12 Player of the Year and three-time all-conference player. The Iowa native played for the Jayhawks from 1994-98 and still ranks No.3 alltime in scoring (2,066 points) and second in rebounds (1,186), one behind all-time leader Danny Manning. His jersey was retired by KU in 2003.

Raef, the third player picked in the 1998 National Basketball Association draft, played 11 seasons in the NBA with the Denver Nuggets, Dallas Mavericks, Boston Celtics and Portland Trailblazers.

John Camien

Camien was a track and cross country standout at Emporia State, where he competed from 1961-65. He was a two-time National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics national cross country champion and All-American and three-time cross country conference cham-

In indoor track, he won eight championships conference alone. During the outdoor competition, John won eight conference crowns and five NAIA national championships, including the 1,500 meters four straight

He is a member of the NAIA Hall of Fame and the Helms Foundation Hall of Fame.

Bob Frederick

Frederick was athletic director at the University of Kansas from 1987-2001 when the Jayhawks won 32 conference championships and had 41 Academic All-Americans. He served on the NCAA basketball tournament's selection committee from 1992-96 and was the chairman in 1995 and 1996.

He played at KU in 1960-61 and was a former high school coach. The Senior Scholar Athlete Award at KU is named in his honor and, in 2010, the NCAA created the NCAA Bob Frederick Sportsmanship Award, which annually honors an NCAA administrator who shows the highest respect for intercollegiate athletics.

Dick Harp

Harp was the head basketball coach at the University of Kansas from 1956-64 and posted a 121-82 record. His 1957 team, led by sophomore All-American Wilt Chamberlain, finished second to North Carolina, losing in triple overtime in the national championship game. The 1960 Jayhawks won the Big Eight Conference title but lost to Cincinnati in the Midwest Regional.

Harp was an assistant coach under Phog Allen from 1948-56 and a starting guard on KU's 1940 team that finished second in the NCAA Tournament. He later served as an assistant coach under Dean Smith at North Carolina from 1986-89.

Don Heinkel

Heinkel was one of the greatest pitchers in Wichita State University's rich baseball history, setting an NCAA record with 51 victories during his career from 1979-82. He was named All-Missouri Valley Conference three times and was a first-team All-American in 1982 when he helped the Shockers to their first appearance in the College World Series with a 16-5 record.

He set WSU records for games started, complete games, innings pitched and earned run average. Don pitched in the major leagues with Detroit and St. Louis and, just last year, became the fourth WSU player inducted

into the College Baseball Hall of Fame.

Willie Jeffries

Jeffries was named the first African-American head football coach at the NCAA Division I level at Wichita State in 1979 and is the only coach ever to coach against both Eddie Robinson of Grambling and Bear Bryant of Alabama.

He coached at Wichita State, Howard and South Carolina State, posting a 179-132-6 record and is also a member of the South Carolina Sports Hall of Fame. He was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 2010. He coached for five seasons at WSU from 1979-83.

Ronnie West

In 1991, West was the first receiver to win the Harlon Hill Trophy, signifying that he was the best player in NCAA Division II. He led Division II in punt return average as a junior in 1990 and totaled 2,070 allpurpose yards and 18 touchdowns.

As a senior, he caught 50 passes for 1,044 yards and 12 touchdowns and helped lead Pittsburg State to the national championship with a 23-6 victory over Jacksonville, Ala. A two-time NCAA Division II first-team All-American and MIAA Player of the Year, West played two seasons in the NFL with the Minnesota Vikings.
