ORDINANCE NUMBER 1614

AN ORDINANCE RESTRICTING VEHICULAR PARKING ON THE SOUTH SIDE OF CRANE STREET IN NORTON, KANSAS, STARTING 194 FEET WEST OF THE WESTERN TERMINUS OF STATE STREET AND CRANE STREET AND THENCE WEST 253 FEET.
NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF NORTON, KANSAS, A MUNICIPAL CORPORATION, AS FOLLOWS:
Section 1: That from and after the effective date of this ordinance, it shall be unlawful to park any motor vehicle, on the south side of Crane street starting 194 feet west of the western terminus of State Street (US Highway 283) and Crane Street and thence West 253 Feet.

Section 2: Violation of this ordinance shall be punishable in accordance with the provisions of the Standard Traffic Ordinance of the City of Norton, Kansas.

Section 3: This ordinance shall take effect from and after the date of its publication in the official city newspaper, and the signs being duly placed.
