

Norton tennis team earns runner up at Hays

Coach Jim Green's Norton Community High School varsity tennis team placed runner-up in the Hays Invitational on Thursday.

Hays Gold won the championship with 22 points, followed by Norton, 17; Russell, 15; Hays Maroon, 13; Colby, 9; Victoria, 4.

In No.1 singles, Norton junior Tawni Griffey remained unscored on in this second tournament of the season to win the gold medal.

She was seeded No.1 and drew a first round bye. Tawni

opened with a 6-0 win over Shelby Dinkel, Hays Maroon and followed that with a 6-0 victory over Emily Wyse, Hays Gold. In the finals, she played Dinkel again and shut her out again by a 6-0 score.

"Tawni Griffey continues to dominate in No.1 singles," said coach Green. "She has not lost a single game in any of her matches. She plays the game extremely well, hitting behind her opponents and to the open areas."

Playing No.1 doubles for Norton were sophomore Haley Wallingford and junior Katie Koch. They also drew a first

round bye. In the second round, they lost 6-2 to Hayes and Branick, Russell. In the consolation bracket, they defeated Schremmer and Schmidtberger, Victoria, 6-2, then outscored Basgall and Hecker, Hays Maroon, 6-4. In the semi-finals, they played Hayes and Branick, Russell, for the second time and were able to defeat them 6-4 to reach the finals, where they lost 6-1 to Pfannenstiel and McRae of Hays Gold and finished runner-up.

"Haley Wallingford and Katie Koch put on an exceptional performance," said coach Green. "Losing to Russell in their first match, they came through the

backside defeating teams from Victoria and Hays to meet the same Russell team in the semi-finals. This time the outcome was different. Haley and Katie defeated the Russell team 6-4 to advance to the finals against Pfannenstiel and McRae of Hays High. I was extremely pleased with their second place finish!"

Norton junior Sierra Black played No.2 singles for the Lady Jays. She also drew a first round bye, then played Kelli Gudenkauf, Russell, and lost 6-3. In the consolation bracket, she won by default over Sara Kuhn, Victoria. Next, she played

Keana Keck, Colby, and lost 6-1 to place fifth.

In No.2 doubles, junior Carla Jo Robinson and sophomore Rickette Green played for Norton. They also drew a first round bye. Their first opponents were Hamel and Dreher of Russell and they lost 6-1. In the consolation bracket, they defeated Robben and Bowman of Victoria 6-4. Next, they played Barnett and DeBoer of Hays Maroon and lost 7-5 to finish fifth.

"Our No.2 entries were also able to score points for fifth place finishes," said coach Green. "Sierra Black continues to put forth a strong effort in singles. At No.2 doubles, we entered a new team of Rickette Green and Carla Jo Robinson. Carla Jo was filling in for Ashley Hildebrand. Playing together for the first time, Rickette and Carla Jo were able to win on the backside to finish fifth."
