Recipes that speak of fall

FALL FESTIVAL

This morning there was a distinct nip in the air. Certain foods come to mind when the first leaf withers as impending autumn brings thoughts of apple cake, stew and soup simmering on the back burner. None of us are so optimistic as to think the hot weather is gone for good, but here are a few recipes that speak of fall to prepare you for Jack Frost's eventual arrival.

We'll begin with dessert in honor of my brother, Roger, who felt dessert should be eaten while you were hungriest. He never could convince Mama but he never failed to try. Be certain you use cooking apples, such as Jonathan's, Rome Beauties, or Winesaps, for this recipe. We never peeled our apples either because the peels add both flavor and color.

HAPPY HARVEST APPLE CAKE:

Three tablespoons butter
One cup sugar
One egg, beaten
One half teaspoon EACH cinnamon, nutmeg, salt, and soda
One teaspoon baking powder
One and a quarter cups flour
Three cups chopped raw cooking apples
Half a cup coarsely chopped walnuts
Ten soft caramel candies, cut into four pieces each
One teaspoon vanilla
Cream shortening and sugar until smooth, add the beaten egg and mix well. Sift all dry ingredients together and add to mixture. Stir in apples, nuts, candies and vanilla. Bake in an 8x8 pan, 40-45 minutes at 350 F. Serve

warm with a scoop of ice cream on top.

Back in the days of yore, wise housewives did not use the oven during hot summer days, so fresh crisp autumn signaled a return to the family's baked favorites. Here is a new twist on the classic meat loaf and baked potato meal.

MRS. M'S FANCY SCHMANCY SUPPER LOAF:

One pound ground beef
Half a pound spicy ground sausage
One cup corn flake cereal, crushed fine
Two eggs
One cup diced onion, divided
One teaspoon EACH Tabasco sauce, garlic powder, salt and pepper
Half cup V8 vegetable juice
Two cups frozen shredded hash brown potatoes
One teaspoon dill weed
One small jar Cheez Whiz
One small can sliced mushrooms
Half cup catsup
Mix beef, sausage, eggs and corn flakes together with half the onion, spices, and vegetable juice and catsup. Pat one third of this mixture firmly into a well-oiled, deep glass loaf pan. Drain mushrooms and press them down to cover this layer. Mix frozen hash browns, dill weed, remaining onion and Cheez

Whiz. Layer over meat and mushrooms. Add the remaining meat mixture, firming it up tight to the edges of the pan. Cover loosely with foil and bake at 350F for an hour until crisp brown around the edges. Spoon off any excess fat, sprinkle top with a little shredded cheese and cut in squares to serve.

A good vegetable to go with supper loaf is this green bean recipe from my mother-in-law.

ALVERNA'S BAR-B-Q GREEN BEANS:

Six slices of bacon cut in chunks and browned
Two bags frozen green beans
One onion, sliced in rings
Half a cup barbeque sauce
Four tablespoons brown sugar
One eighth teaspoon liquid smoke
Combine onion rings, bacon and some bacon drippings with brown sugar, sauce, smoke and one cup water. Bring to a boil, add green beans, turn down to simmer until beans are tender. Add salt and pepper to taste.
Run out to the nearest ditch and pick a jug full of the last of the sunflower blossoms or some yucca stalks to decorate your table and you're all set for a nice warm supper in the sunset hour. Sure wish I could join you!

Group ponders station's future

In a recent meeting of the Norton County Ministerial Alliance concern was raised regarding the future funding of the local Christian radio station, KSNB, 91.5 FM.

91.5 FM is an affiliate station of American Family Radio, based out of Tupelo, Miss. The station has been broadcasting to the Norton County area since the late 1990's.

At that time there was no Christian radio available to this area. "Our group was very happy to be able to bring family radio programming in for a very minimal cost," notes Alliance president, Kirk Kasson. "Those costs have risen considerably in recent months, and with our primary concern being resident emergency needs, we are considering whether we should

continue to fund this station."

Kasson adds that the options for Christian Radio are much greater today. "Most people I talk to prefer the other available stations." My Bridge Radio, 99.3 in Overton, Neb., reaches much of Norton County, as does Bott Radio, 104.5 out of Lexington, Oberlin and Phillipsburg have local affiliates similar to Norton's American Family Radio broadcast. "Adding AM stations and the internet, there really are a lot of choices, said Kasson." American Family Radio is also available via the internet.

The Alliance is the primary source of income for the station, providing for the tower rental as well as the utility costs. "For our board, it really is a question of priorities. We know there are several people in the area who

really like American Family Radio. There is no real way for us to find out how many people would miss it. We would love for people to contact us if they have ideas for increasing the amount of funding necessary to keep it going, said Kasson."

"The station has been a blessing, but the general sentiment of the ministers at today's meeting was to focus our funds on the local economic hardships. The funding of the station is not as imperative as it once was."
