Parks was born in Fort Scott. In 1938, Parks purchased his first camera at a pawn shop. He pursued taking pictures with gusto and within months his probing portraits of African-American women were exhibited in the windows of the Eastman Kodak store in Minneapolis.

In 1949, Parks became the first black staff pho-

tographer at Life Magazine, where he would remain on the masthead for a quarter century. "The camera is not meant to just show misery," he explained. "You can show beauty with it; you can do a lot of things. You can show things you like about the universe, things you hate about the universe. It's capable of doing both."

Norton girls take victory at Cambridge

The Norton Community High School varsity girls basketball team shot more accurately and rebounded better last Tuesday evening when they traveled to Cambridge, Neb. and returned with a 39-29 victory.

Coach Kevin Jilka's Lady Jays held quarter leads of 10-5, 20-16 and 33-25.

"We really got after it tonight," said coach Jilka. "Our girls played very hard and a lot more physical than we have."

"Offensively, we did a good job all night long of being patient and taking good shots."

"Free throw shooting continues to be a problem and we need to fix that."

"Defensively, it was by far our best effort. We did a lot of good things, especially in the rebounding area as far as blocking out and getting the basketball."

"It's nice heading into the Christmas break with a win. We can take a few days off and come back ready to go."

Leading scorer and rebounder for Norton was senior post Caren Thomson with 11 points and 6 rebounds. Caren hit 5 of 8 two-point attempts for 63 percent accuracy from the field and was 1 of 2 from the free throw line. In rebounding, she pulled down 3 offensive and 3 defensive boards.

Second high scorers for Norton were junior point guard Tawni Griffey and sophomore guard Katelyn Engelbert with 10 points each. Griffey swished 2 of 7 shots from beyond the arc for 29 percent, 2 of 4 two-point shots for 50 percent and 4 of 11 overall for 36 percent.

Engelbert missed all three shots from long range but hit 5 of 9 two-point shots for 56 percent accuracy.

As a team, Norton hit 2 of 11 shots from beyond the arc for 18 percent, 13 of 29 two-point tries for 45 percent and 15 of 40 overall for 38 percent.

Cambridge missed all 6 shots from long range, hit the same 13 of 29 two-point attempts as Norton for 45 percent and was 13 of 35 for 37 percent overall.

From the free throw stripe, the Lady Jays hit 7 of 18 tries for 39 percent. Cambridge swished 3 of 5 for 60 percent.

Norton outrebounded Cambridge 24-19. The Lady Jays pulled down 10 offensive and 14 defensive caroms and the Lady Trojans grabbed 3 offensive and 16 defensive rebounds.

Rebounding for Norton, in addition to leader Thomson, were: Engelbert, 5; Kamilla Jones, 4; Griffey, 3; Bailey Ambrosier, 3; Alec Melvin, 3.

The Lady Jays had 10 steals and the Lady Trojans stole the ball 8 times. Griffey was thefts leader for Norton with 4, followed by Ambrosier, 3; Engelbert, 2; Thomson, 1.

Both quintets had 7 assists. Griffey and Jones led Norton with 3 apiece and Engelbert had 1 assist.

Norton had 17 turnovers but the Lady Jay defense caused the Lady Trojans to turn the ball over 23 times.

Junior varsity won, too
 The Norton junior varsity girls quintet defeated Cambridge 24-18.
