Accident Reports

June 7-A red 2002 Pontiac Grand Am, driven by Daniel L. Tien of Prairie View, was traveling east bound on U.S. Highway 36, in a construction zone, when Tien ran over a traffic cone which caused the rubber base to hit the side of the vehicle. The impact was enough to deploy the side curtain airbags and causing over \$1,000 in damage. No injuries were reported. The accident was investigated by Norton County Sheriff Officer Adam Wahlmeier.

June 27-A red 2012 Dodge Avenger, driven by Craig P. Knapp of Norton, was traveling south bound on U.S. 283 when a deer ran onto the roadway from the west ditch. June 30-A tan 2007 Chevrolet K2500 pick-up, driven by Raymond Slipke of New Almelo, was traveling west bound on County Road CC when a deer ran onto the road and impacted the side of his vehicle, causing over \$1,000 in damage. No injuries were reported. The accident was investigated by Norton County Sheriff Officer Rich Wenzl.

June 30-A white 1996 Dodge

1500SLT pick-up, driven by Andrew James Richard McMullen of Norton, was traveling south bound on county road E2 when the right rear tire blew out, causing McMullen to lose control of the vehicle and roll into the west ditch. The accident caused over \$1,000 in damage to the vehicle. No injuries were reported. The accident was investigated by Norton County Sheriff Officer Rich Wenzl.

July 1-A red 2005 Ford Five, driven by Anthony M. Wente of Norton, was traveling east bound when a dog ran out in front of the vehicle.
