Fire narrowly misses farm home

A rural Norton family has much to be thankful for after a large grass fire missed their home by a few short feet Thursday evening south of Norton.

The Norton Rural Fire Department was dispatched to the farm of Bill and Joy Johnson at just after 6 p.m. Thursday evening about four miles south of Norton on Highway 283. Norton Rural Fire Chief Steve Otter reports that the fire was likely sparked from a lit cigarette tossed from a passing vehicle on the west side of the highway at the intersection of Road Q, south of the Johnson home.

Because of extremely dry conditions and a strong wind from the south, however, the fire traveled very quickly and was nearing the Johnson house by the time fire crews arrived.

Joy Johnson, who was working her job at Farm Bureau when the fire started, reports that her husband, Bill, was home at the time with their

Pre-fair events are scheduled for Norton County

Ahead of the upcoming Norton County Fair, several events have been scheduled that 4-H and community members may be interested in.

This year's Fun Day Horse Show will be held Saturday at the Norton County Equine Facility at Elmwood Park.

Entry/check-in will be held at 8 a.m. with the show beginning at 9 a.m. The show is open to youth and adults of Norton and other counties. The events that will be held are showmanship, western horsemanship, trail, reining, poles, barrels and pair sack race.

The 4-H and FFA Youth Horse Show

5K race will be Saturday, July 28 at high school

To raise money for scholarships, the Alum for Athletes 5K run/walk will be held Saturday, July 28 in Norton.

The race will be held at the Norton Community High School parking lot and all students, alumni and supporters are invited to participate. Included in the day will be a 5K race and 1-mile fun walk and a 1-mile kids race.

According to information from event organizers, a group of young professionalss and former Blue Jay athletes came up with the race concept to keep teenagers in classrooms and on the playing field instead of causing trouble. Scholarships are a great way to encourage student athletes to continue in higher education and proceeds from the Alum for Athletes race will help make sure students can pursue their goals in college.

On the morning of the race, preregistration will be held at 6 a.m. with a 7 a.m. start for the 5K run. The onemile walk will begin at 8 a.m.

will begin at 9 a.m. on Monday, July 23, with entry and check-in at 8 a.m. The show will begin with the halter, showmanship and pleasure classes. The 4-H and FFA Horses will be stalled through Thursday of the Fair at the Norton County Equine Facility. The Youth Team Penning event will be held at the Equine Arena Tuesday, July 24 after the swine show (about 8 p.m.). This event is sponsored by the Norton County Saddle Club.

The Ranch Rodeo will be held at 7 p.m. on Wednesday, July 25 and the Jackpot team roping, sponsored by the Norton County Horse Council will be held at 8 p.m. on Thursday, July 26.

The 4-H Pet Show will be held Monday at the Andbe Home in Norton. The show is scheduled for 6:45 p.m.

Members of 4-H will be on hand to display their hand pets, cats, and dogs. The cat and hand pets will be shown at 6:45 p.m. and the dog show begins at 7:30 p.m.

Next Tuesday, the 4-H Fashion Re-

vue and clothing judging will be held. At 1 p.m. will be the Clothing Construction show and at 5:30 p.m., the Clothing Buymanship show will be held. The outfits will be modeled in the fashion revue on Saturday, July 21 at 7 p.m. All three shows will be held at the 4-H building.

In the construction phase, 4-Hers will exhibit garments and articles they have constructed and also model outfits and accessories they have made. The 4-H Clothing project also includes two Buymanship phases. These 4-Hers select outfits from the ready-to-wear market for their clothing wardrobe.

Wheat producers are encouraged to enter the Market Wheat Show at the Norton County Fair this year. The entries will be collected at the fair and sent to the State Grain Inspection Service to determine the physical properties such as test weight, protein and

Scores will be tallied after the official grading is done. Results of final scores will be sent out to the participants after

All that is needed is a bin run sample of about five pounds. Submit this in a container or a large baggie-style freezer bag that is sealable. A large coffee can is about the right amount to submit. Samples do not need to be sifted or cleaned.

A data entry form must be filled out as well. The score also depends upon some of the information filled out on the card, such as variety type, growing conditions and cultural practices used with growing the wheat. You do not need to fill out a white fair entry card.

The brown entry cards can be picked up at the Twin Creeks Extension Office (785-877-5755) or contact Dwight Heikes who is superintendent of Crops and Wheat. Producers may leave their samples at the Twin Creeks Extension Office, 107 S. State Street, downtown Norton, before the fair or can take them to the 4-H Building on entry day, Tuesday, July 24 by 1 p.m.
