

Norton volleyball kicks off season this Friday

The Norton Community High School volleyball team will open their 2012 season this Friday by hosting Northern Valley and Plainville, beginning at 4:30 p.m.

Varsity matches will be played in the Stull Gym. Norton will play Plainville, followed by Plainville vs. Northern Valley and Norton vs. Northern Valley.

Kevin Jilka returns this year as head coach of the Lady Jays, following his initial season last year.

Jilka had never coached volleyball until last season but has been the head girls high school basketball coach at Norton Community High School for the past 30 years.

His assistant coaches again this year will be Traci Uehlin and Jodi Ward.

Coach Uehlin is a former head vol-

leyball coach at Golden Plains and coach Ward is a former Norton Community High School player who went on to play basketball at the University of Nebraska at Kearney.

This year's roster consists of 25 girls, including six letter winners and four starters.

"We are trying to work hard to get to that level and our players understand that. We are anxious to get going."
