ily just to run a lot and bike a lot, but with many years of both under his belt, training came easier for him than it might for his competitors.

"I'm a stay-at-home dad and have my own business from home, I have to be home a lot," he said. "There were a ton of long runs starting at 3 a.m. this past winter, heading out in the dark to run up in the mountains with a headlamp, then getting home before my wife goes to work. On my free days, it was a lot of four to five hour runs and bike rides. I would run 60-100 miles a week and bike 5-10 hours a week."

For such a dedicated athlete, Waggoner said deciding to compete in the Leadman race was a natural progression from what he had been doing as he was looking for the next big challenge.

"I did very well at Ironman, then I ran well at the 100 mile run as the next challenge," he said. "Then I raced the 100 mile bike last year, then I was looking for the next big challenge and Leadman made sense."

Though intense training and competition can take a toll on the human body, Waggoner

said he feels his best when he is pushing his mental and physical limits. He said he feels much worse when he is just sitting around because being out of shape hurts far worse than being in very good shape.

To avoid injury, Waggoner said he lifts weights, but he mostly focuses on never getting out of shape.

"I'm 41 years old and I'm stronger and lighter than I was in high school," he said.

Now that he has accomplished the task of breaking the course record for the Leadman race, Waggoner said he intends to focus more on weight lifting and training for track races in the coming year. Regardless of his pursuits, however, Waggoner attributes his success to his wife and children.

Tim and his wife, Joanna, have two sons, ages 5 and 3. Ben and Oliver, Waggoner said, make his world go round and help keep him grounded in reality.

When he isn't training and racing, Waggoner likes to spend time with his children, who have taken an interest in bow hunting and fishing. Though the boys are interested in running, Waggoner said he isn't pushing them into any activities they don't want to

do. For now, he said, they would rather hunt and fish.

"I've been married for 12 years, so at this point my wife is quite used to all this. She's watched me race all over the world and push myself almost every day for the past 12 years," Waggoner said. "She's my rock and I couldn't do any of this without her, nor would I want to."
