

Lady Huskies lose to Tigers

The Northern Valley Lady Huskies hosted the Stockton Lady Tigers on Tuesday, Jan. 22 in Alma, losing a competitive contest 51-41.

Stockton established its perimeter game early and Northern Valley struggled offensively. The Lady Tiger's led 12-5 at the end of the first quarter. Junior Caitlin Lingg scored six points, hitting two buckets and two free throws for the Tigers. Senior Sierra Brown hit on a 3-pointer and sophomore Morgan Beougher added three points with a field goal and a free throw attempt.

Freshman Sarah Baird scored three of the Huskies five points in the quarter hitting on three of four attempts from the free throw line and freshman Brooke Baird buried a jumper for two points.

In the second quarter, the Lady Huskies picked up their

offensive but so did the Lady Tigers. Senior Erika Chandler scored four points on a jumper and converting two of four from the free line. Freshman Shayna Vincent added two points on a jumper and sophomore Kortney Cunningham went two for two from the charity stripe. Brooke and Sarah Baird both converted one of two free throws but the Lady Huskies couldn't slow down Stockton's offense.

Beougher led the Tigers with seven points in the quarter, burying two jumpers and going three for four from the free throw line. Lingg had three points on a jumper and a free throw, senior Hannah Lindsey two points on a jumper, as did junior Janassa Swaney. Sierra Brown had one point, hitting one of two free throws. The Tigers led by 12 points at halftime over the Huskies, 27-15.

In the third quarter, the Lady Huskies outscored the Lady Ti-

gers 15-11. Cunningham scored eight points hitting three two-point field goals, and two out of two free throws. Brooke Baird added five points including a 3-pointer and Chandler had two points.

Swaney scored six points for the Tigers on three field goals, Beougher buried a trey and Lingg added a jumper, but the Huskies cut the lead to eight points, 38-30, going into the fourth quarter.

The Huskies closed within five points but couldn't get any closer. Beougher hit a field goal and three of four free throws, Lindsey had four points on two jumpers and Sierra Brown had four points on a jumper and two free throws for the Tigers.

Sophomore Khrianna Van Patten had the hot hand for the Huskies in the final stanza burying a trey and a 2-point field goal, Cunningham scored four points on two field goals and

Vincent scored on a jumper as well, but the Huskies came up short, falling to the Tigers by 10 points, 51-41.

"We got down early and picked up our intensity in the second half," said head coach Logan Kats. "We came within five points in the fourth quarter but couldn't come away with the win. We need to do a better job starting (the game) with more intensity and have better execution for all four quarters."

Northern Valley Huskies beaten by Stockton Tigers

The Northern Valley Huskies boys basketball team lost to a good Stockton Tigers team, 69-56, on Tuesday, Jan. 22 in Alma.

The difference in this game was no mystery. Tigers senior Koby Beougher led all scorers with 28 points, including six 3-pointers. The first quarter ended with the Tigers doubling up the Huskies 22-11. Beougher led the Tigers charge with three field goals and a trey. Junior Reed Stephens buried two 3-point shots, sophomore Justin Wiltfong scored two baskets and sophomore Jaden Williams

added three points on a bucket and a free throw.

Huskies sophomore Matt Stutsman had the shooting touch in the first quarter scoring eight points on two 3-pointers and a jumper. Junior Jordan Baird added a field goal and junior Ian Vincent went one for two from the free throw line.

In the second quarter the Huskies cut into the Tigers lead behind the shooting of senior Tyson Callaway, converting three field goals and four of four free throw attempts for 10 points. Juniors Hunter Chandler and Baird scored a basket each, senior Phillip Compton added two points on two free throws, and

Vincent hit on one of two free throws.

The Tigers Beougher had eight points in the quarter, including two 3-pointers. Sophomores Andrew Bellerive, Christian Hamel and Jaden Williams rounded out the scoring with a field goal each, and the Tigers led the Huskies by eight points at halftime, 36-28.

In the third quarter Wiltfong caught fire, scoring 11 points on four baskets and hitting three of four free throws. Beougher scored a 2-point and 3-point basket and Stephens scored a basket as well.

The Huskies tried to keep pace. Phillip Compton scored

five points on two baskets, including a 3-pointer, Stutsman and senior Jon Compton scored a 3-pointer each, and Vincent scored a two point basket, but the Huskies would trail by 13 points going into the fourth quarter.

The Tigers lead would hold up with both teams scoring 15 points in the final stanza.

Beougher converted two more 3-pointers for the Tigers, Williams had four points on two field goals, Hamel scored three points on a trey, and Wiltfong and sophomore Kale Kuhlman scored one point each, hitting one of two free throws.

Stutsman scored five points

for the Huskies on 3-point and 2-point baskets. Sophomore Clint Cole, Phillip Compton, Callaway and Baird scored a bucket each and Chandler added two points on two of four shooting from the charity stripe.

Beougher and Wiltfong accounted for 44 points as the Tigers beat the Huskies 69-56.

"We played a fairly solid game against a good team. I was happy with the way we executed our press," said head coach Chuck Fessenden. "Stockton shot the ball very well from the 3-point line. Our effort was very good tonight."
