

Kansas Honor Scholars named

A total of 27 seniors from high schools in Graham, Norton, Osborne, Phillips and Smith counties will be recognized April 4 for their academic achievements and named Kansas Honor Scholars at a 6:30 p.m. dinner and program at the Dane G. Hansen Memorial Plaza Community Room, 110 W. Main St., Logan.

During the ceremony, each student will receive a Webster's New College Dictionary presented by Megan Toth, coordinator of alumni programs for the KU Alumni Association.

Don Steeples, McGee Distinguished Professor of Applied Geophysics at the University of Kansas, will speak to the students and their parents and guests.

Honored students will be guests of the alumni association and KU Endowment; parents and area alumni are welcome to attend at a cost of \$15 each.
