### PUBLIC HEARING NOTICE

The City of Norton will hold a public hearing on Wednesday, July 17, 2013, at 5:45 p.m. at the Norton City Office, 301 E. Washington, Norton, Kansas, for the purpose of considering an application to be submitted to the Kansas Department of Commerce for Small Cities Community Development Block Grant funds under the Downtown Commercial Rehabilitation category. A specific project application to be discussed is rehabilitation of the building located at 109 E. Main Street that will consist of renovations including but not limited to exterior building stabilization of the foundation, brick and stucco; construction of a new roof system; and removal/replacement of 15-20 linear feet along the north and east side of the building for stability and support. Alternates consist of glazing replacement of one storefront window at the southeast corner of the building and/or replacement of twenty upper level windows acceptable within the Norton downtown historical district guidelines. A map of the proposed project site can be viewed at the office of the City Clerk. The estimated total project cost is \$250,000 with the grant request for \$187,500 of the project costs. Oral and written comments will be recorded and become a part of Norton's CDBG Citizen Participation Plan.

Reasonable accommodations will be made available to persons with disabilities. Requests should be submitted to the City Clerk of Norton by July 15, 2013.
