

Georgia recognizes conceal carry

Georgia has notified Kansas that it has begun recognizing Kansas concealed carry licenses, Kansas Attorney General Derek Schmidt announced today.

Georgia is now the 33rd state to recognize Kansas concealed carry licenses, and the third state to begin recognizing Kansas licenses since the passage of a new law

in Kansas earlier this year. That legislation, recommended by the Kansas Attorney General's office, allows all valid out-of-state permits to be recognized in Kansas when the non-resident permit holder is traveling temporarily in Kansas.

Georgia's reciprocal recognition will allow Kansas concealed carry license holders

to lawfully carry concealed handguns in conformance with Georgia laws while traveling in that state.

A complete list of states that recognize the Kansas concealed carry license is available on the Attorney General's website at www.ag.ks.gov. There currently are 67,240 active Kansas concealed carry permits.

The new system has a lens that will see in the dark, he said, which will save the county money in having to do a new lighting system the jail area, which he had considered since it is hard to see at night and he doesn't want to have to leave the lights on all the time.

There are also extra cameras with the new system, he said. The jail only needs 12 or 13 but the system comes with 16. So, the sheriff said that he would put the extra cameras on the outside of the courthouse for better security around the building.

It will take a couple of weeks to get the system installed, he

said.

The commissioners agreed with the sheriff on the need for speed and, since there is no one in Norton County who could supply this type of system, said that it would be OK to take the single bid this time.

The sheriff said that four horses that were picked up earlier because they were without food and water have been dealt with. One had to be put down and that cost \$150, he said, but the other three have been purchased by a man from Oberlin. The sheriff said that Larry Griffin helped his department with water, time and equipment to care for the horses while they were in the county's care.

The sheriff also said that he has talked three times with the promoters of a Bike Bash in Lenora and hopes everything has been worked out.

"I hope and pray that it goes off like they hope it will go off," the sheriff said adding that he's worried because it will be on highway K-9, which isn't too straight.

He said that he has checked out several things that he had questions on and found that things like the wet T-shirt and bikini contests are legal and not considered lewd by the courts.

"I hope everybody will be happy and safe and have a good time," the sheriff told the commissioners.

if it would be possible to sell that building for enough to buy and renovate another place for the business incubator.

"If we could make enough on it and buy something else and fix it up," said board member Donna Foley, "It would be a way of helping downtown."

Mr. Sproul said that Economic Development works with the Chamber on this project and it would take both groups agreeing and finding another place.

In other business, the board:

- Heard that work on the Ryan Addition is going well and

should be done by the end of September.

- Was told that a downtown market study has been started and will hopefully be completed by the end of September. This will allow the group to apply for economic development money in the form of a Community Block Development Grant from the government.
- Agreed to have Mr. Sproul attend the Nex-Generation Career Fair and Expo in Stockton on Wednesday, Nov. 6. About 600 young people attend the fair which is sponsored by NexTech, he said. It costs \$100 for a booth and last year, Mr. Sproul said,

he passed out employment literature for Natoma, New Age and the prison system.

- Accepted the resignation of Board Chairman Aaron Herman. The City of Norton will need to refill the opening.
- Learned that a prison work crew will be in to do painting and repairs to the old Moffet Station Building, which houses the Chamber and economic development offices.
- Heard that it should be possible to hold a Norton County Day at the capitol and the cost will probably be about \$10,000.
