

Steady improvement earns Norton wins

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Coach Christine Thompson's Norton Community High School volleyball team showed steady improvement with wins over Goodland and Dundy County in matches on Thursday in Norton.

The Lady Jays defeated Goodland 25-16, 25-20 and outscored Dundy County 25-13, 25-22.

In the other match, Goodland defeated Dundy County 25-18, 25-12.

"As the season progresses, our varsity is improving with each playing date," said coach Thompson. "Even though our girls are still making some errors in which they have control over, overall I am very pleased with their play."

"The coaches and I have been worried about the mental aspect of the game more than our skill level to this point. These matches proved that mentally we are starting to understand the game. Our hitters are consciously hitting the shots that I am asking for and we are pulling ourselves out of mentally tough situations."

"During our last match against Dundy County, we were down by a big margin in the second set but came back and won to win the match."

"I truly believe that all of our girls are getting a better grasp of the game; they are constantly asking questions. Nothing makes us more proud as coaches than when we can communicate

Kills leader was Cox with 11, followed by Bohl, 7; Bailey Ambrosier, Ruder, 2 each.

Bailey Ambrosier was digs leader with 7, followed by Miller, 4; Bohl, 2; Cox, 1.

Bailey Ambrosier had 1 block. **Dundy County**

Hager had 3 serving aces, followed by Bailey Ambrosier, 2; Bohl, 1.

Setting assists leader again was Ruder with 15, followed by Miller, Casey Ambrosier, Cox, 1 each.

Cox led again in kills with 9, followed by Bohl, 8; Bailey Ambrosier, 4; Ruder, 3; Casey Ambrosier, 1.

Digs leader was Miller with 5, followed by Bohl, Bailey Ambrosier, Ruder, Cox, 1 each.

Cox led in blocks with 3, followed by Bailey Ambrosier, 2; Casey Ambrosier, sophomore Peyton Renner, 1 each.

Next action

Norton will play today in the Volleyball Triangular in Hill City, beginning at 4:30 p.m.

Hoxie will be the third team playing.

The high school matches will be in the High School Gym. The schedule is Norton versus Hill City, Norton versus Hoxie and Hill City versus Hoxie.

The same schedule will be followed for the junior varsity matches, which will be played in the Grade School Gym.

NOTICE TO AIRPORT CONSULTANTS

The Norton City/County Airport Board is hereby soliciting statements of qualifications and experience from airport consultants for projects at the Norton Municipal Airport. Subject to receipt of Federal funding, these projects may include the following:

1. Taxiway Construction and Lighting
 2. Runway Extension and Widening
 3. Pavement Rehabilitation
 4. Airfield Lighting Improvements
 5. Apron Expansion
 6. Hangars and Other Buildings
 7. Access Road and Parking Lot Improvements
 8. Associated work items and general airport engineering
- The required services include, but are not limited to, engineering services for preliminary, design, bidding and construction phases including incidental special services for the above listed projects funded under the FAA Airport Improvement Program.

A qualification based selection process conforming to FAA Advisory Circular 150/5100-14d will be utilized to select the most qualified firm. Fee information will not be considered in the selection process and must not be submitted with the statement of qualifications.

Selection Criteria will include: Recent experience in airport projects, capability to perform all aspects of project, reputation, ability to meet schedules within budget, quality of previous airport projects undertaken, interest shown, and consultant qualifications.

Fees will be negotiated for projects as federal funds become available. Prospective consultants are advised that applied overhead rates must be in accordance with the cost principals established within Federal Regulation 48 CFR Part 31, Contract Cost Principles and Procedures. The successful firm will be required to submit a copy of their current overhead rate audit certification.

This required is subject but not limited to the following federal provisions: Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 Section 520 of the Airport and Airway Improvement Act of 1982 DOT Regulation 49 CFR Part 18.36(i) - Access to Records DOT Regulation 49 CFR Part 20 - Lobbying and Influencing Federal Employees DOT Regulation 49 CFR Part 26 - Disadvantaged Business Enterprises Participation DOT Regulation 49 CFR Part 29 - Government-wide Debarment and Suspension DOT Regulation 49 CFR Part 30 - Federal Trade Restriction Clause Interested firms should submit three copies of their statement of qualifications and experience along with references to the following address, no later than October 17, 2013.
