

Huskies cage the Tigers

The Northern Valley Huskies traveled to Stockton on Friday and beat the Tigers 72-44. The Huskies running game was in high gear as they compiled 601 yards rushing and 10 touchdowns.

In the first half, the Huskies kept the Tigers at arms distance. Senior Hunter Chandler scored twice in the first quarter on runs of 1 and 12 yards, respectively. Senior Jordan Baird picked up where Chandler left off in the second quarter with two scores of seven and 35 yards. Chandler would score again from 25 yards out just before the half, giving the Huskies a 34-22 lead at the break.

The third quarter started with Chandler scoring his fourth touchdown on the night from 19 yards out giving the Huskies a 20 point lead, but it would quickly

disappear.

The Tigers scored two long touchdowns on the following two possessions. The first came from Colton Hull who scored on a 47 yard run, and the other came from Ethan Hamel's 65 run through the Huskies defense, which cut the lead to four points, 42-38.

However, junior Phillip Bryant and Baird put any fears to rest with two touchdown runs each. Bryant opened the fourth with a 65 yard score, followed by Baird's two scores of 55 and two yards. Bryant closed the game out with a nine yard score giving the Huskies a 28 point win over the Tigers, 72-44.

"We got off to a good start in this game and took an early 14-0 lead. However, the game was fairly close after that," said head coach Chuck Fessenden. "Stockton closed the gap to four points late in the third quar-

ter. Our kids really responded well with a 30 point fourth quarter. We struggled defensively with the option. On offense, our line did a good job of blocking and three of our (running) backs had huge nights. We rushed for over 600 yards. This week we will have to play much better on defense against a very good Thunder Ridge team."

Junior Huskies improve their record

The Northern Valley Junior High Huskies beat the Golden Plains Bulldogs handily, 66-20, on Thursday in Long Island and improved their overall record to 5-1. The Huskies and Bulldogs played six-man football and the contest ended in the third quarter with the 45-point rule in effect.

The Huskies were consistent and dominant, scoring 22 points in each quarter. Caden Kinderknecht scored two rushing touchdowns in the first quarter, Nick Stutsman had two in the second, and Riley Sides had two in the third quarter.

"The Huskies had a great offensive game led

by quarterback Caden Kinderknecht, who ran for three touchdowns and passed for another," said head coach Jim Cole. "Seventh graders Riley Sides and Nick Stutsman also ran the ball well, scoring two touchdowns each. The Husky defense struggled early against the Bulldogs' spread offense, but improved their tackling as the game progressed."

The Huskies will close out their 2013 season on Thursday in Long Island when they take on Logan/Damar.

ORDINANCE NO. 1647
AN ORDINANCE RESTRICTING VEHICLE PARKING AND MANDATING CERTAIN HANDICAP PARKING ON THE NORTH SIDE OF THE 100 BLOCK OF EAST LINCOLN STREET, WITHIN THE CITY OF NORTON, KANSAS.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF NORTON, KANSAS, A MUNICIPAL CORPORATION, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: That from and after the effective date of this ordinance, it shall be unlawful to park any motor vehicle, unless such vehicle bears a special license plate or identification card issued pursuant to K.S.A. 8-161 or 8-1,124 and is being operated by or used for the transportation of a handicapped person or disabled veteran from a point starting at the back of the curb line on North Kansas Avenue thence West on East Lincoln Street twenty-five feet to a point forty-nine feet West of the back of the curb line on North Kansas Avenue.

Section 2: Violation of this ordinance shall be punishable in accordance with the provisions of the Standard Traffic Ordinance of the City of Norton, Kansas.

Section 3: This ordinance shall take effect from and after the date of its publication in the official city newspaper, and the signs being duly placed.
