Individuals can earn certification through testing related to reading, applied math, and locating information through the WorkKeys® skills assessment system available through KansasWorks.

The Kansas WORKReady! Certificate is a statewide initiative designed to confirm a quality workforce and economic development in Kansas. The certificate, powered by WorkKeys®, is a nationally recognized assessment-based credential that gives employers and job seekers a uniform measure of key workplace skills. The certificate denotes that the certificate holder

possesses the foundational skills required to achieve success in the workplace. It is a portable credential, allowing job seekers and employers to use it anywhere in the United States.

This program is quickly becoming recognized as a tool to assist businesses in determining qualifications for potentially under-employed personnel, determining training

needs for increased productivity among existing employees, and for use in hiring to meet labor needs.
