

New business in Norcatour

Attic full and running over? No room to park the car in the garage? Don't like your boat sitting out all winter?

If you need a safe, dry place to store your seasonal decorations or extra furniture, Norcatour Storage will be able to help.

Jim Plotts of Norcatour and his partner, John Geisinger of Selden, are in the final stages of building the 14-unit storage facility. There will be six 12-foot-by-24-foot units, four 12-by-16 units and four 12-by-8 units, Mr. Plotts said. The structure was framed with 2-by-4-inch lumber and finished with pro-pal steel siding and roof.

"John and I have been talking about doing this for several

years," he said. "When this lot became available, we decided to go ahead with the project. Folks in Norcatour have been very encouraging, and we've had lots of positive comments about our progress."

The storage units are on the northeast corner of the first intersection on the blacktop road leading into Norcatour off U.S. 36.

Construction began in late August after LeRoy Spreser leveled and graded the lot. Mr. Spreser is also delivering millings that will be spread on the apron in front of and behind the storage units. Mr. Plotts, with the help of his son James, and Brian Barnett, both of Norcatour,

poured the concrete pad. Oberlin Concrete furnished the concrete.

Mr. Plotts took three weeks off from the project after having gall bladder surgery Sept. 10. He is putting the finishing touches on this week and said he will have everything finished in the next few days. He said five units are ready now.

"We saw a need," said Mr. Plotts. "I'm glad we were able to do something to bring new business to Norcatour."

Workshops for ag producers set

Kansas State University will host two Risk Assessed Marketing Workshops to help agricultural producers navigate the uncertain business climate linked to volatile crop prices and the lack of a new Farm Bill. The workshops will be Nov. 20-21, 2013 in Manhattan and Feb. 26, 2014 in Scott City.

"The lack of a new Farm Bill leaves questions unanswered for those who operate the 2.2 million farms throughout the Unit-

ed States," said Art Barnaby, agricultural economist with K-State Research and Extension. "Farmers have the risk of their Farm Service Agency safety net changing, and when we do have a new Farm Bill in place, it will likely include changes to crop insurance. The lack of certainty in the commodity programs, plus expanded bio-fuels and ethanol usage, combined with volatile crop prices is leaving many producers considering

different methods for managing yield and price risk."

The workshops are designed to introduce producers to an integrated marketing and production management approach that combines government programs, crop insurance and alternative marketing techniques. Among the topics addressed are: crop insurance, selling crop insurance-covered puts, futures, put and call options, forward contracts, marketing loans and

basis contracts.
