Another great year for Norton runners

The Norton girls won seven meet championships in addition to placing runner-up for the third straight year in the Class 3A State Meet. The Blue Jay boys, hampered by injuries most of the season, had one championship, two runner-up finishes, a third, fifth and sixth place and tenth place finish in the State Meet.

The Norton girls were winners of the Norton Invitational for the eighth year in a row and the Blue Jay boys won the league crown for the fifth straight year.

The Lady Jays were Mid-Continent League cross country champions for the sixth year in a row and the Norton boys, who had won the league title for nine straight years, placed runner-up.

It was the fifth straight year that both the Norton girls and boys had qualified for the state meet.
