

Huskies walk away with victory over Cheylin

 The Northern Valley High School boys basketball team hosted the Cheylin Cougars on Friday, Feb. 7, and came away with an 18 point victory, 65-47. It was a very competitive first quarter. Brant Cox scored seven points and Matt Stutsman five points, in the quarter for the Huskies as they took a 16-13

lead. In the second quarter, Hunter Chandler had the hot hand inside the paint, scoring eight of the Huskies 15 points. The Cougars kept pace with 13 points and trailed by five points at the half, 31-26. The Huskies pulled away from the Cougars in the third quarter with a 19 point outburst. Five Huskies scored in the quarter.

Jordan Baird had six points, including a 3-pointer and Matt Stutsman scored five points with a 3-pointer as well, and the Huskies extended their lead to 13 points going into the fourth quarter, 50-37. The Huskies scored 15 points in the final stanza, with Baird and Clint Cole contributing six and five points, respectively. The Cougars ran out of fight


