**NOTICE OF HEARING ON PROPOSED ZONING AMENDMENT AND ZONING CHANGE WITHIN THE CITY OF NORTON, KANSAS**

805 W. Washington in Norton, Kansas and further described as: A tract of land commencing at a point on the south line of Section Thirty-four (34), Township Two (2) South, Range Twenty-three (23) West of the Sixth Principal Meridian, where the south line of the Chicago, Burlington and Quincy Railroad right-of-way intersects said section line, thence running East three hundred three and one-half (303 ½) feet, thence North to the right-of-way line of said Railroad, thence Southwesterly along said right-of-way to the place of beginning; and a tract of land described as commencing at a point Eighteen (18) rods and 2 ½ feet East of a point on the South line of Section Thirty-four (34), Township Two (2) South, Range Twenty-three (23) West, Norton County, Kansas, where the South boundary line of the Burlington and Southwestern Railway, now known as C.B.&Q. & Q R/W intersects said Section line, running thence East four (4) rods and eight (8) feet, thence North to the right of way to a point on a straight line running North and South to point of beginning, running thence South and parallel with the East line of said tract to the place of beginning, being a part of the Southeast Quarter of the Southwest Quarter (SE1/4SW1/4) of Section Thirty-four (34), Township Two (2) South, Range Twenty-three (23) West of the 6th P.M., all within the City of Norton County, Kansas.
