Thelma M. Dieleman

Thelma M. (VanDeWege) Dieleman, 84, died Dec. 6, 2003, at Norton County Hospital.

Mrs. Dieleman was born June 15, 1919, in Republican City, Neb., the third child and only daughter of John and Mary (Rebman) Graf. She had three brothers Glen, Ervin and Rueben. In March of 1920, the family moved by horse and wagon to a farm west of Alma, and several years later to a farm west of Long Island.

She began school in Alma, finished grade school at the country school, Willowdale, and graduated from Long Island High School in 1937.

Beginning college at Kansas Wesleyan in Salina, she later transferred to Fort Hays State, where she obtained her education degree in art and business.

She was a member of Delta Sigma Epsilon Sorority.

Mrs. Dieleman was baptized and confirmed a Lutheran but later became a member of the Long Island United Methodist Church. She was also a member of United Methodist Women, Homemaker's Club, the American Legion Auxiliary, and the Wyoming Pioneer Association.

On June 20, 1946, she married William J. VanDeWege, and together with her daughter, Roxanne, and his daughter, Rosetta, they formed a family. The next year twin girls, Sharyn Dee and Karyn Lee, were born.

A teaching career of 30 years began at Willowdale Country School and continued at Long Island High School until consolidation in 1967, when she became the art instructor in Norton. The photography and journalism classes that she taught published 20 year-books, many of them award-winning. She retired in 1979.

On Sept. 8, 1979, she and J.C. (Jack) Dieleman were married and enjoyed 17 years together, living in Torrington, Wyo., in the summers and Long Island in the winters.

Mrs. Dieleman was preceded in death by her parents; her husband William in 1970; her husband Jack in 1996; a daughter, Sharyn; a grandson, Abraham Sloan; and a niece, Marilyn McLoed.

Survivors include daughters, Rosetta and Joe McFarland, Norton; Roxanne and Conrad Cox, Long Island; Karyn and David Gunzelman, Sylvan Grove; a son-in-law, Howard Sloan, Hays; two sisters-in-law, Winona Amen, Illif, Colo.; and Maxine Graf, Kearney; 11 grandchildren; and 14 great-grandchildren.

Funeral services were held Dec. 9 at the Long Island Methodist Church with Pastor Shelly Cox officiating. Loraine Thalheim accompanied vocalists Charlene Ross and Staci Montgomery, who sang "I'll Fly Away" and "Rock of Ages".

Casket bearers were Clark Cox, Paul Ganzelman, John Ganzelman, Isaac Sloan, Jacob Sloan and Joseph Sloan. Abraham Sloan as an honorary casket bearer.

Burial was in Long Island Cemetery.
