

Girls take first

Lady Devils bring home three in row

The Decatur Community High girls track team won its third meet in a row last Tuesday.

The Oberlin girls came in first at the Rawlins County Invitational Track Meet in Atwood. On April 8, they took first in Hoxie and on April 1, they were first in a triangular meet in Atwood with Rawlins County and Quinter.

Tuesday, the Lady Red Devils posted 195 points, followed by Rawlins County, 133; Dundy County, Neb., 105; Hitchcock County, Neb., 64; Colby, 32; and Bethune, Colo., 15.

It was a 1-2-3 finish in the 100-yard dash as the Oberlin girls raced down the field. The Lady Devils won two out of three relay events and came in second on the third. They posted three other individual wins.

The Oberlin boys came in second last Tuesday with 123 points. On April 8, they placed fourth in Hoxie and on April 1, third in Atwood. The boys had three individual firsts and two first in relay races.

The Dundy County boys took first with 155 Tuesday, followed by Oberlin; Rawlins County, 118.5; Hitchcock County, 81; Colby, 42.5; and Bethune, 34.
