Coyote/Wildcats win one, lose one

The Jennings/Lenora boys finished their regular season with a 91-59 loss to the powerful Brewster Bulldogs and a 63-62 victory over the Herndon Beavers.

While they were outscored in every quarter but the fourth, the Coyote/Wildcats fought hard throughout the Brewster game.

The Bulldogs took a 21-10 lead at the end of the first quarter and increased it in the second, outscoring the Coyote/Wildcats 30-20 to lead 51-30 at the half. In the third quarter, the Bulldogs again hit hard, outscoring Jennings/Lenora 22-10 to lead 73-40. In the fourth quarter, the Coyote/Wildcats edged the Bulldogs 19-18 as the bench came in for the top-ranked Brewster squad.

Scoring for the Coyote/Wildcats

were Russell Miller, 19 points; Wes Dubois 13; Jared Foster, 10; Adam Wahlmeier, 5; Benjamin Bird, 4; and J.J. Lahnanen, Chris McKenna, Ben Rhodes and Justin Bolt, 2 each.

On Friday the Coyote/Wildcats traveled to Herndon to edge the Beavers.

It was a tough, back-and-forth game with the teams tying at 18 at the end of the first quarter. In the second quarter, the Beavers scored 18 to Jennings/Lenora's 9 to lead 36-27 at the half. In the third quarter, the Coyote/Wildcats made their move, outscoring the Beavers 19-12. The Beavers still led 48-46, but in the fourth quarter the Coyote/Wildcats came from behind with 17 points to Herndon's 14 to win by a point.

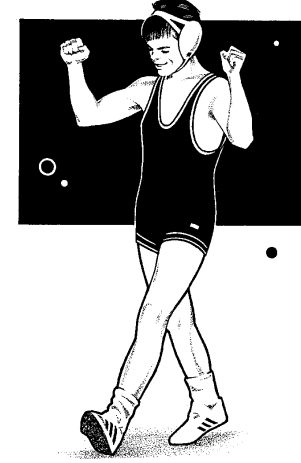

Oberlin wrestlers send six to state tournament



Oberlin will be sending six wrestlers to the Class 3-2-1A state tournament in Hays this weekend.

Decatur Community High had 13 wrestlers at regionals in Ellis and brought home fourth place. Hoxie took first, Norton second and Atwood third.

Leading the Devils at 135 pounds, senior Bryan Miller, last year's state champion, took first at regionals.

Taking third place and headed for state were junior Brent Olson, freshmen Chance Harman and Kenyon Badsky and senior Stean Olson. Freshman Matt Coleman took fourth and will also go.

"I thought we wrestled pretty well, but we lost a couple of tough matches that would have sent two more to state," Coach Joe Dreher said. "I was pleased with our overall effort. We just have to stay focused and wrestle well this weekend."

While the Decatur Community Junior High seventh graders scored 10 points in the each of the first three quarters and a pair in the final one, the St. Francis girls were able to score only a single point in the third quarter and a pair of baskets in the fourth.

"The first quarter started slow for the Red Devils," Coach Cindy Sattler said, "but once they got started they were hot. Kaitlyn Stapp scored 16 points."

"The girls pressed well causing turnovers and stolen passes. All the girls played aggressively and forced turnovers."

Scoring besides Stapp were Kaydee Leitner, 8; Whitney Beinke, 4; and Lydia Karnopp and Anne Wasson, 2 each.

In fifth-quarter play, Sunnie Jo Fredrickson made 4 points while Jennifer Shaw and Leitner made 2 each. The eighth graders also won their

"The girls had a hard time getting fired up in the first half," Coach Jennifer Monaco said. "We shot well from the field in the second quarter, but St. Francis hung on with their free throw shooting. We ended the game being outscored by 8 points in fourth quarter and still came out on top. The girls never lost their composure."

In the first quarter, Oberlin outshot the Indians 4-1. In the second quarter, each team scored 8 points for Oberlin to lead 12-9. The Devils hit 13 to the Indian's 4 in the third quarter to maintain a 25-13 lead. In the fourth quarter the Indians got hot and hit 16 points to Oberlin's 8.
