Nelli Zimmerman is spending a month working at the Decatur County Hospital under the guidance of Dr. Richard May as part of her requirements for medical school. Ms. Zimmerman is a fourth-year student at the University of Kansas Medical School. She said she decided to go into medicine after she volunteered

at a hospital while she was in high school, and went to the University of Kansas because it is close to home. Originally from Topeka, she lives in Kansas City now. Though she will graduate in May, she said she hasn't decided what kind of medicine she wants to practice. In June, she will leave for San Diego for a year to do an internship,

which means she will do a little bit of every kind of medicine. For now, she is in Oberlin for a month doing a rural rotation, which is a requirement for school. Ms. Zimmerman said she had her choice among family practice, pediatrics, surgery or obstetrics. She chose family practice. She started last week in Oberlin, working under Dr. May. Ms. Zimmerman has been seeing patients, ordering tests and doing whatever Dr. May will let her do. Of course, she said, he signs off on everything. From the experience, she said, she hopes to gain an appreciation for rural Kansas. She said she hasn't spent a lot of time out this way, and also wants to get a sense of family practice. Ms. Zimmerman is a newlywed: She and Brian Wilson, who is in physical therapy school, were married in June.

Farmer's markets have rules

Farmer's market season is approaching. These markets are a great resource for fresh produce and other foods. In Kansas, there are rules and regulations for the sale of foods in farmer's markets. Here are a few you should consider before starting a farmer's market or taking some of your products to one:

- Frozen meat is allowed only if processed in state or federal facilities and kept frozen.
- Fresh meat, meat products, poultry and fish are prohibited.
- Eggs must be kept refrigerated. Producers must register with the Kansas Department of Agriculture.
- Homemade jams and jellies are allowed. All other home-canned

foods are prohibited.

- Foods not deemed potentially hazardous are allowed. These include baked goods like cookies, breads, fruit pies, cakes and cinnamon rolls. Other foods include fruits, vegetables, nuts and honey.
- Packaged foods must be properly labeled with the name of the product and the name and address of
