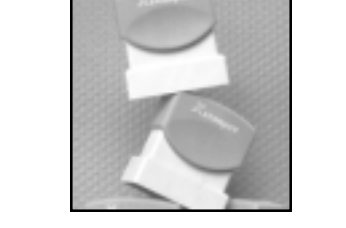
Howard E. Janousek, 84, a 1939 graduate of Decatur Community High School, died June 21, 2005, at Memorial Hospital in McPherson.
