Woman named daycare manager

Little Sam's Daycare at the Good Samaritan Center has a new child care provider at the helm.
Beth Miller started at the center on Oct. 17, taking over for Barb Berry.
Mrs. Miller has a degree in early childhood care and development from McCook Community College. After completing college, she worked for a year in a child development center in McCook and then moved to Oberlin, where she has worked as an aide at the center for five years.
She has two children, Haley, 4 and Austin, 4 1/2 months, so she is familiar with day care. Mrs. Miller said the one her daughter went to was closing and one of the other

mothers asked her about starting one.
She said she started thinking about getting into child care when she heard Little Sam's was closing, so she jumped in.
The daycare has 13 kids, all with different schedules. Mrs. Miller said she can't have more than seven or eight at a time. Depending on the age of the child and the hours, though, she might be able to take a few more.
The center offers games, toys, videos, two meals and two snacks for the kids. Mrs. Miller said it is pretty much the same as before, but she isn't going to offer preschool like Mrs. Berry did.
Services are provided from 5:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Monday through Friday. The center is open to all children, not just those whose parents work at the center.
Mrs. Miller is from Herndon and is married to Tony Miller.

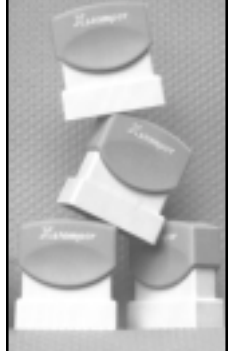
