Rena D. Garwood

Rena Dorothea Garwood, 88, a native of Norcatour, died Feb. 1, 2006, at the Norton County Hospital.

She was born Oct. 10, 1917, at Norcatour, the daughter of John Franklin and Rettie Florence (Alexander) Gallentine. She grew up in the Norcatour community, attended Norcatour Grade School, and graduated from Norcatour High School. She lived in Colby for several years, then during World War II she worked for Beech Aircraft in Wichita.

She married John H. Garwood on Oct. 29, 1943, in Newton. They moved to Norcatour in 1946, and to Oberlin in 1948, where she worked in the laundry department of Decatur County Hospital. In 1986, she moved to Norton to be near her family. She was a member of the Norcatour United Methodist Church, the Norton Senior Center, and had held local and state offices in the Rebekeh Lodge.

Survivors include three children, Thomas Garwood, Norton; Dorothea Jimenez, Grand Junction, Colo.; and Mary and Roger Vanover, Clayton; a sister-in-law, Frances Gallentine, Denver; four grandchildren; and two great-grandchildren.

She was preceded in death by her parents; her husband; a son, Gary; three sisters, Mae Temple, Idah

Ervin, and Nellie Gallentine; two brothers, Frank and Noel Gallentine; three brothers-in-law; a sister-in-law; and a son-in-law.

Funeral services were held Monday afternoon at the United Methodist Church in Norcatour. Kathy Aeillo officiated and burial was in the Norcatour Cemetery.
