The Decatur Community High School FFA is asking local farmers to donate grain to help the chapter with funds and to give the ag business class experience in marketing.

Vice President Kayla Zodrow, who is also the Northwest Kansas FFA president, has sent area farmers a letter asking them to donate 30 bushels or more of any fall grain crop to the Oberlin FFA.

The club would like to set up a fund to send members to leader labs, and state and national conventions, as well as establishing contests in hope of building up the agricultural program.

Decatur Coop, Hansen Mueller, and D & S grain are providing storage for corn so the agricultural business class can market it.

Other grain donated will be sold on the cash market as it comes in, and the money will go directly to the

FFA. The FFA members will then learn how to market the stored grain in the classroom.

"The local FFA chapter is growing," said Kayla, "with many new members interested in agriculture as a field of study. We are very excited with the leadership opportunities we have for our upcoming year."

In order to build up the program, the FFA needs the community's support.

"We are an agricultural-based community and helping us start out with quality agriculture programs will help our future in agricultural positions," said Kayla.
