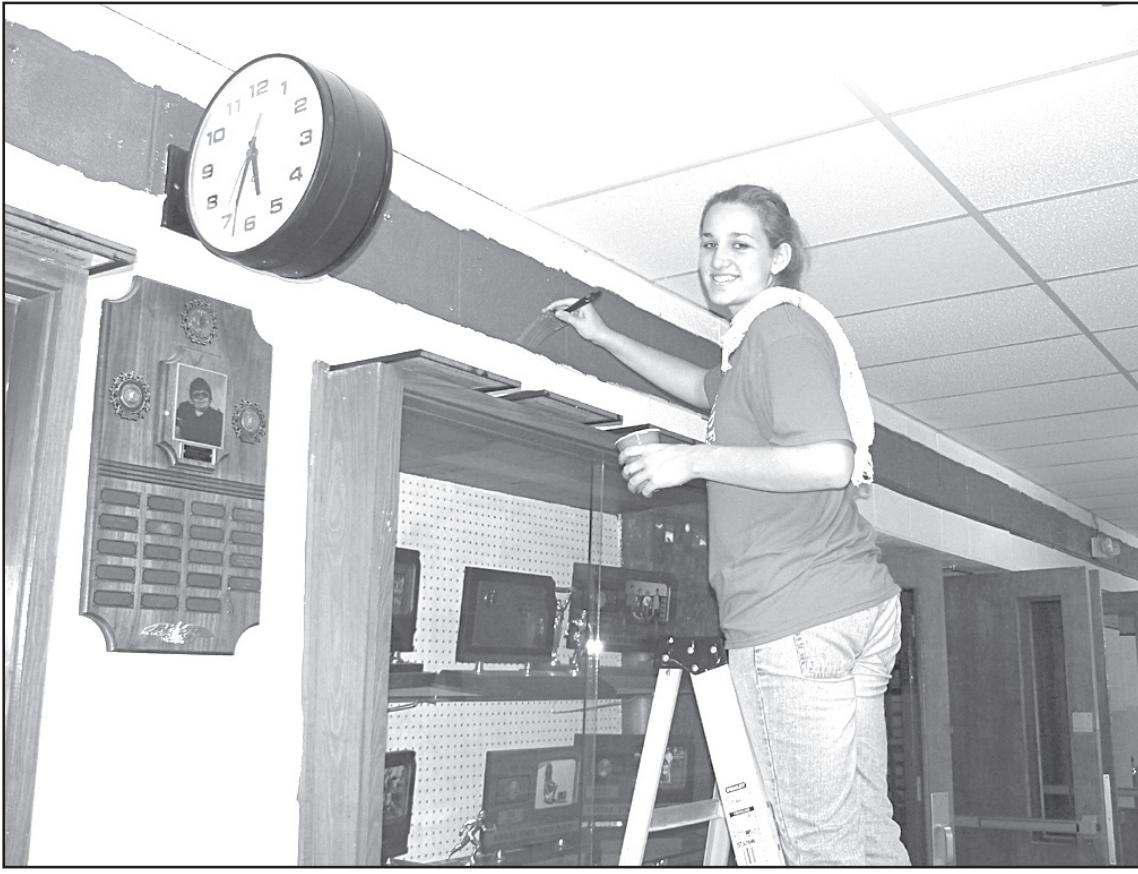


# Stripes bring spirit

## Advisory teams make team posters

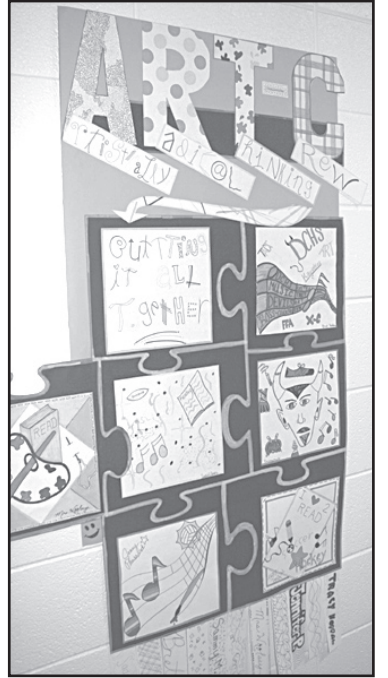

## Annual cleanup set for Monday evening

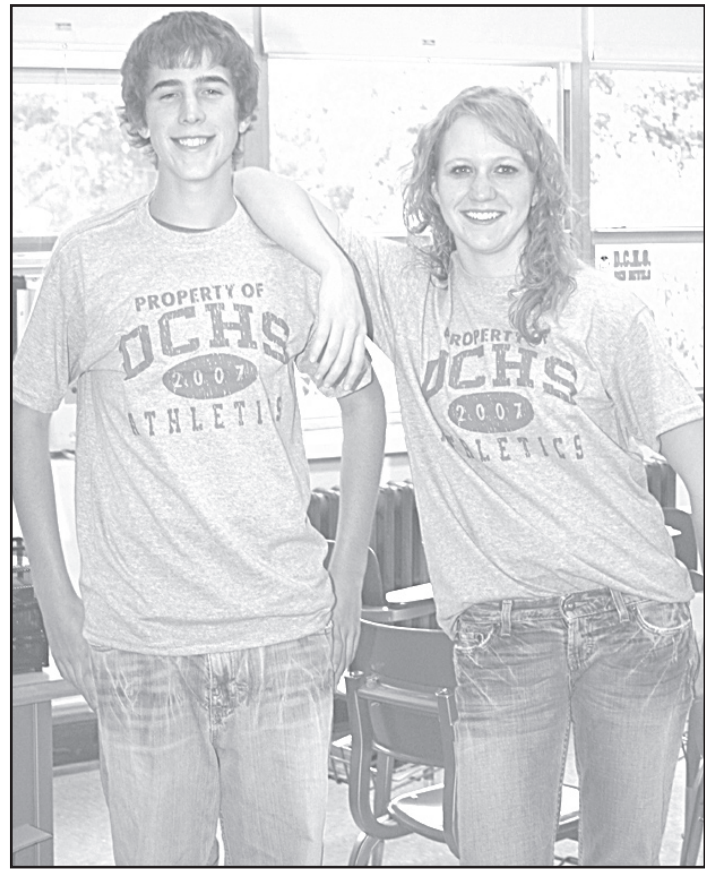
