

# Eighth, seventh take 2nd Oberlin attends Atwood tourney instead of Quinter

The Decatur Community Junior High School seventh-grade boys and girls and the eighth-grade boys finished second at the Rawlins County Invitational Track Meet on April 16. The eighth-grade girls tied for third.

The young Red Devils had been scheduled to face Quinter but that meet was cancelled. At the same time, Oakley dropped out of the Atwood Invitational.

Rawlins County asked Oberlin Activities Director Joe Dreher to have his students fill the vacancy.

The seventh-grade Colby young Lady Eagles won the meet scoring 176 points followed by Oberlin, 100; Rawlins County, 72; and St. Francis, 52.

The seventh-grade Colby boys took first with 220 points followed by Oberlin, 98; St. Francis, 66; and Rawlins County, 42.

Miki Dorshorst led the seventh-grade girls with a pair of firsts in the 100-meter dash and triple jump. Darbi Rouse and Jordi Wasson took firsts in the high jump and pole vault.

Zach May led the seventh-grade boys with three firsts in the 100-meter hurdles, long jump and triple jump.

Whether it was great defense or lack of repetitions on offense, neither the University of Kansas Jayhawks nor the Kansas State University Wildcats had much to brag about after their spring football games last month.

Of the two touchdowns scored by the Blue team for the Jayhawks, in the 17-3 victory over the Kansas White team, only one came on offense, an 8-yard touchdown pass by Todd Resing to Dexton Fields in the fourth-quarter.

Kansas State's only score in the 3-0 defensive battle in Manhattan saw McCook's Josh Cherry kick a 51-yard field goal to put the White over the top against a stubborn Purple team early in the fourth-quarter.

The Wildcats may have found a blue-chip prospect in junior transfer running back Keithen Valentine from Mississippi Delta Community College, a 5 foot, 9 inch, 193 pound cut-back runner who rushed for 106 yards for the losing Purple team.

The Jayhawks witnessed Salina Central junior Jake Sharp rush 10 times for 40 yards and Dexton

Passing wise, Resing continued to look sharp throwing 43 times connecting on 23 passes for 227 yards and a touchdown.

Pittsburg junior quarterback/wide receiver Kerry Meier threw 18 times completing 13 for 69 yards and also caught four passes for 40 yards.

Kansas State starting quarterback junior Josh Freeman only played one quarter.

He had a lack-luster passing game only hitting one of four for 9 yards and one interception.

Freeman, who weighs 265 pounds, looked slow at times when rolling out during passing situations.

He will be pushed by 6-3 and 200

pound sophomore Carson Coffman, his backup, who played quarterback for the Purple team. Coffman threw 14 times completing six for 41 yards and was sacked twice.

The Wildcats played 16 mid-semester transfer athletes. Kansas only three.

Kansas State Coach Ron Prince's team finished 5-7 last year, while Kansas Coach Mark Mangino's Jayhawks finished 12-1 including a bowl victory in post-season play.

Each team has its skeptics for the up coming season.

Prince's overall record at Kansas State is 11-14 in his two-year stint. Mangino's record is 37-36 since 2002.
