Lady Devils beat Oakley, fall to Hill City

The Lady Red Devils volleyball team beat Oakley but fell to Hill City last Tuesday in Oberlin to take its record to 10-5.

The Decatur Community High girls took the Oakley Lady Plainsmen down in two sets, 25-18 and 25-11.

"The girls came out and played this match well," said Coach Sherri Ruf. "They stayed aggressive and communicated with each other. We were able to get some blocks and take Oakley out of their game."

Oberlin's top players:
• Server — Adrienne Pauls, seven of seven with an ace.
• Passer — Elisa Jones, nine service points.

• Setters — Jessica Fredrickson and Jordan Dreher, 11 set assists each.

• Hitters — Dreher with 10 kills and Pauls with seven.
• Blockers — Pauls and Dreher, two each.

The Oberlin girls started out well against Hill City, downing the Lady Ringnecks 25-22. After that, however, it was all Hill City, as the visitors won the next two sets 25-19, 25-9.

"The girls did not move their feet or communicate in this match,"

Coach Ruf said. "We just had too many errors to win. Our setters were setting off the net and our hitters were hitting out of bounds.

"This was one of those matches where nothing was going our way."

Top players:

• Server — Jones, 13 of 13 with two aces.

• Passer — Jones, 19 of 24 with 12 perfect.

• Setter — Fredrickson, 10 set assists.

• Hitters — Pauls, 12, and Dreher, seven.

• Blocker — Pauls, three points blocked.

Oberlin's junior varsity beat Oakley 25-17, 25-20, but fell to Hill City 25-22, 25-23. The junior varsity is now 10-3.

Oberlin's C-team record is 2-4 after losses to Norton and Oakley.

On Saturday, the varsity girls were at a tournament in McCook and the C-team was at a tournament in Phillipsburg.

The Oberlin C-team Invitational Tournament will start at 9 a.m., Saturday. The varsity is next slated to play in St. Francis on Tuesday, Sept. 30, against the Indians and the Cheylin Cougars.

Devils bring home first win of season

After a couple of tough starts, the Decatur Community High Red Devils came out strong Friday night and shut out the Plainville Cardinals 34-0 in Plainville.

The Oberlin boys were able to score a touchdown in each of the first three quarters and a pair in the fourth while keeping the Cardinals from crossing the goal line.

Oberlin's defense was able to keep the Cardinals from completing their passes and kept the home team from making much headway on the ground.

In the first quarter, senior quarterback Logan Fortin hit Sam Stapp

with a 12-yard touchdown pass. The point after was no good, but Oberlin was on the board and leading 6-0.

Fortin took the second touchdown in on a two-yard run in the second quarter. Again the point after was no good. At the half, Oberlin lead 12-0.

In the third quarter, Fortin hit Lucas Juenemann with a 13-yard pass for the Red Devils' third touchdown. This time, Fortin hit junior Toby Peters for the two-point conversion, and Oberlin was ahead 20-0.

In the fourth quarter, Peters caught a 17-yard Fortin pass for the Red Devils' fourth touchdown.

The point-after pass was caught by Juenemann for another 2 points.

Oberlin's last touchdown came on a 13-yard run by senior Jacob Fortin. The point-after try was unsuccessful and the game ended with Oberlin putting its first win in the book.

The team is now 1-2.

Fortin hit 12 of 18 pass attempts for 17 yards and three touchdowns.

Leading rushers for the Red Devils were L. Fortin, 67 yards on 17 runs; J. Fortin, 65 yards on 12; Stapp, 25 on seven; and Juenemann, 53 on eight.

Receiving from Fortin were Peters, four for 74 yards and a touchdown; his cousin J. Fortin, three for 21; Stapp, three for 18 and a touchdown; Juenemann, two for 29 yards and a touchdown; and Wiley Farr, one for 28 yards.

Oberlin was able to out throw and out run Plainville 388 yards to 46 in total offense.

This week is homecoming and the Red Devils will meet the Rawlins County Buffaloes from Atwood on the field at 7 p.m. Friday.

The traditional homecoming dance will be held Saturday.

Girls Volleyball Team loses two matches at McCook Tournament

Nebraska was not kind to the Decatur Community High volleyball team on Saturday, as the girls lost two out of three matches at a tournament in McCook.

Oberlin beat Broken Bow but lost to both Imperial and Southwest High School.

The Lady Red Devils were able to down Broken Bow in two sets, 25-9, 25-14.

"The girls stayed aggressive in this match," Coach Sherri Ruf said. "There were several free balls and off-speed hits in this match that we were able to return with a pass, set, hit."

The girls from Southwest were able to stop Oberlin in two sets 25-19, 25-18.

"The girls came out in this match fired up and ready to play. They were playing aggressive and getting some blocks at the net," Mrs. Ruf said. "We were able to get a lead and then we started to make errors at the net and serve receive. Most of the points earned at the end of each game were due to our team errors."

with an ace.

• Passer — Jones, 27 service points and three digs.

• Setter — Fredrickson, five assists, and Dreher, three.

• Hitters — Dreher, six kills, and Pauls, four.

• Blocker — Pauls, four points blocked.

down Oberlin.

The Nebraska girls won 25-21, 23-25, 25-19.

"The girls played well at times in this match, and then at times we didn't get into coverage," Coach Ruf said. "We needed to play with consistency in this match."

• Passer — Jones, 50 service points and 17 digs.

• Setters — Dreher, 20 assists, and Fredrickson, 15.

• Hitters — Dreher, 15 kills, and Pauls, 13.

The Lady Red Devils' record now stands at 11-7.

The varsity girls have the week off. On Saturday, the team will hold a C-team tournament in Oberlin.

The varsity will play next at 4 p.m. Tuesday in St. Francis against Sainty and Cheylin.
