Swimmer named tops in conference

Decatur Community High graduate Heather Glodt was named the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference Female Swimmer of the Week after helping the University of Nebraska at Kearney Aqualopers take third at a meet at Grinnell College in Iowa on Jan. 21.

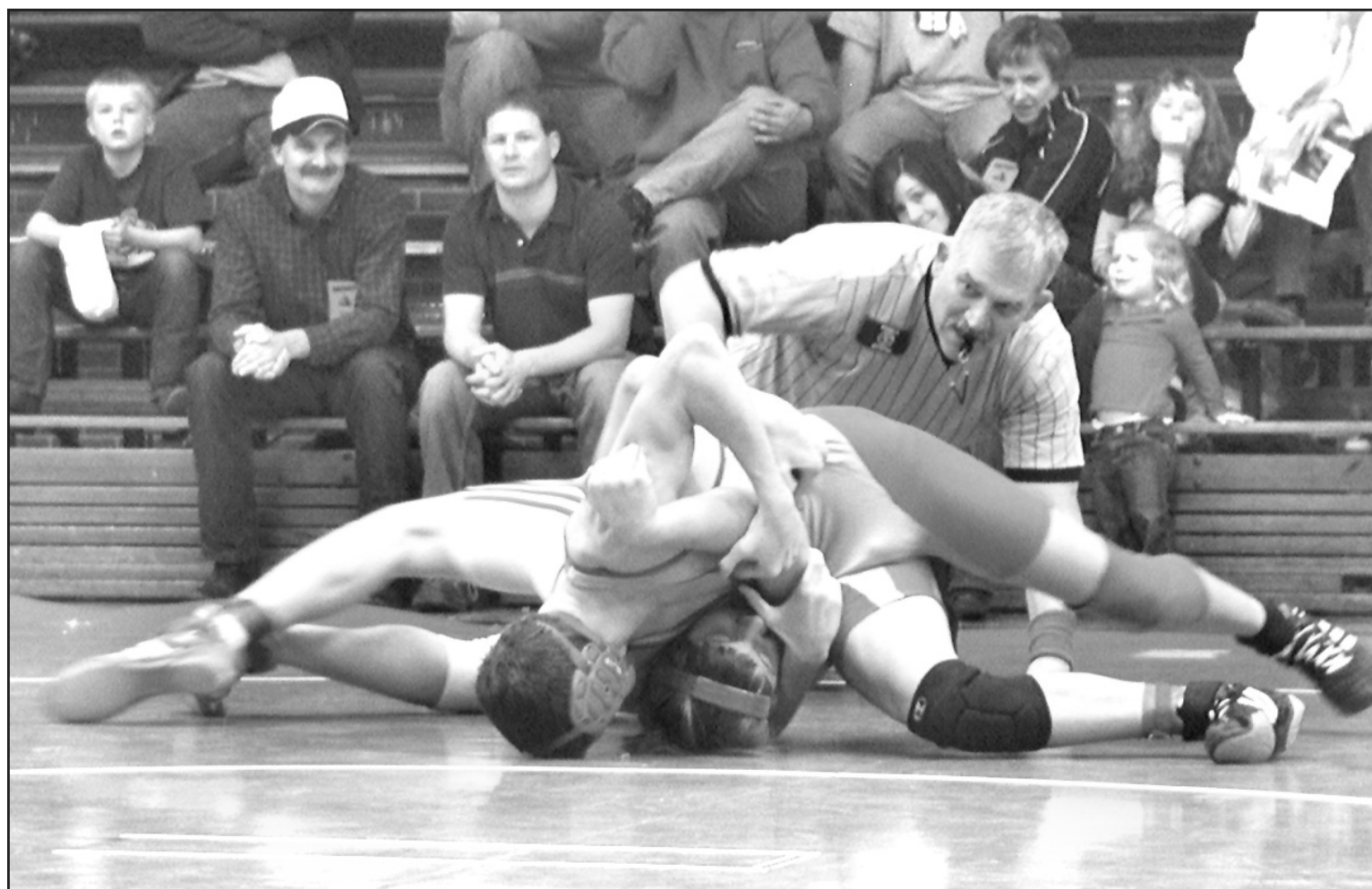
Glodt placed third in the 100-yard butterfly in 1 minute, 5.28 seconds, and seventh in the 50-yard freestyle in 26.28 and 100-yard freestyle in 58.12. She also swam on all four of the college's relay teams.

Then on Jan. 30, Glodt won three events and helped her school take a 145-76 win over Morningside College out of Sioux City, Iowa.

Glodt, who was a star swimmer when she lived in Oberlin, won the 50-yard freestyle in 25.96 seconds, the 100-yard butterfly in 1:04.64 and the 100-yard breaststroke in 1:15.37. All three were season-best times for her and amount to the 10 fastest in the college's history.

Oberlin pins Hoxie

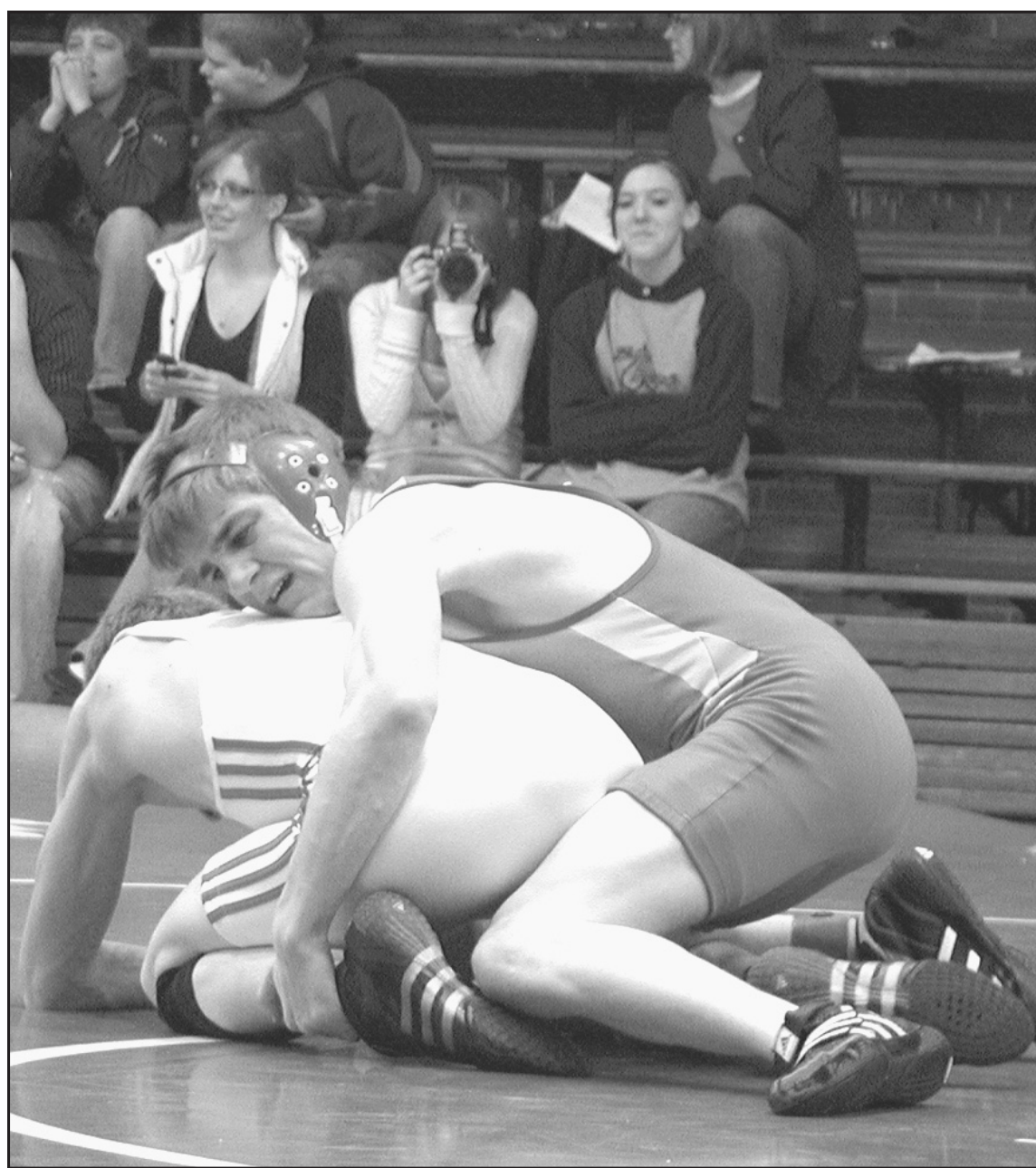
The Oberlin Red Devils wrestlers downed the Indians 44-26 on Friday in Hoxie.

Neither team had a full squad, but Oberlin had one more wrestler than Hoxie. That made only a slight difference in the point total.

Both teams were open at 103 pounds and Oberlin had to forfeit at 130 and 285, losing 12 points. Hoxie had to forfeit at 171, 189 and 215 pounds for 18 lost points.

The win gave the Decatur Community Red Devils a 4-2 season in league duals, as they won over Oakley, Hoxie, St. Francis and Atwood and lost to Colby and Goodland, both much larger schools with mostly full squads.

Scoring were T. Anderson and Blau, 13 points each; Stacy, 4; and S. Anderson 2.

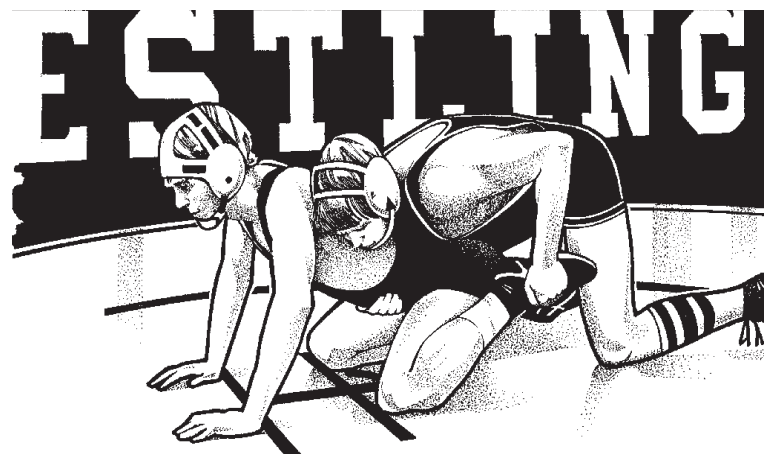
