## Donald Martin Feely

Donald Martin Feely, 66, Hemet, Calif., grandson of M.G. Feely, who operated the original Feely Store in Jennings, died Sunday, June 14, 2009 at Brian LGH West Hospital in Lincoln, Neb.

Mr. Feely was born Oct. 10, 1942, in Los Angeles, to Martin Gerald Feely and Jessie Smillie Feely.

He was a fire fighter for the California Department of Forestry and retired as a battalion chief after 28 years. He was an Eagle Scout; served as Master of the Hemet Masonic Lodge; was an elder of the Hemet First Presbyterian Church and sang in the choir; and was a member the Hemet Harmonizers Barber Shop Choir.

He also worked part-time for the Camp Oakes YMCA as a rifle range instructor, to teach children gun safety. He enjoyed fishing,

hunting and outdoors activities. He owned farmland near Jennings, and each November he and his brothers made a pheasant-hunting trip to Jennings.

Survivors include his wife of 42 years, Lynne Irene (Rittenhouse) Feely; a son, Matthew Scott Feely, Chicago; a daughter, Anita (Dave) Rees, Westborough, Mass.; and two brothers, Gordon Feely, Prescott, Ariz., and Dennis Feely, Valparaiso, Neb.

Services were June 22, 2009, at the church in Hemet. Arrangements were handled by Miller-Jones Mortuary and Cremations, 1501 W. Florida Ave., Hemet.

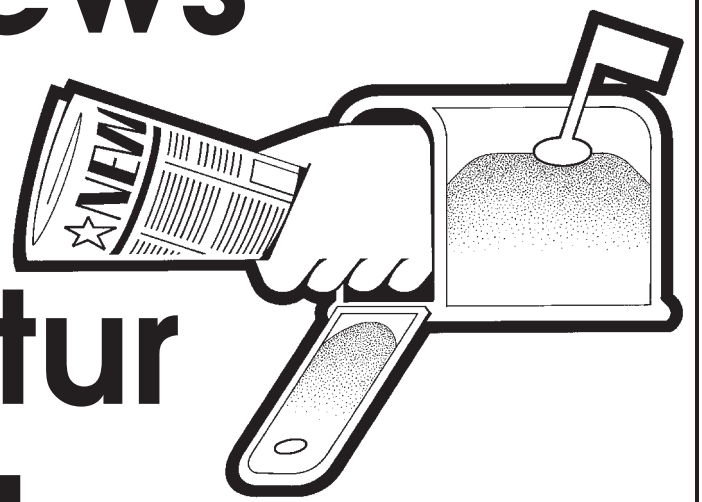
