Kearney won the tournament with 254 points followed by Goodland, 114.5; Smith Center, 94; Oakley, 87; McCook, 86; Osborne, 61.5; Oberlin, 55.5; Hill City, 48; and Wray, Colo., 48.

While Oberlin had a lot of open weights, the Red Devils also ended up with five medal winners. Nolan Peters and Jaxen Alstrom took third and Brent Juenemann, Gatlin Reichert and Daniel Jordan came in fourth.
