## Oberlin girls take down Lady Bulldogs

The Decatur Community High Lady Red Devils basketball team downed the Golden Plains Lady Bulldogs 69-32 last Tuesday in Oberlin.

Oberlin jumped out to a 19-4 lead in the first quarter as five shooters found the basket and four out of five free throws went home for the Lady Red Devils.

Oberlin kept up the pressure, sinking 21 points in the second quarter with six shooters finding the basket and all four charity shots dropping in. The Lady Bulldogs put up 12 points in the quarter, so Oberlin led 40-16 at the half.

In the third quarter, Oberlin continued its hot shooting, hitting for 19 points to Golden Plains' 8. In the fourth, with the score 59-24, Oberlin backed off and outscored Rexford 10-8 to win 69-32.

Because of the early lead, Oberlin was able to get several of the younger girls in the game.

The Lady Red Devils hit 12 of 15 free throws for 18 percent while Golden Plains hit 12 of 16 for 75 percent.

• Brandi Diederich, 6 free throws for 100 percent, two rebounds, two assists and two steals.

• Jessica Fredrickson, 4 points, two rebounds, four assists and three steals.

• Tiffany Anderson, 2 points, an assist and a steal.

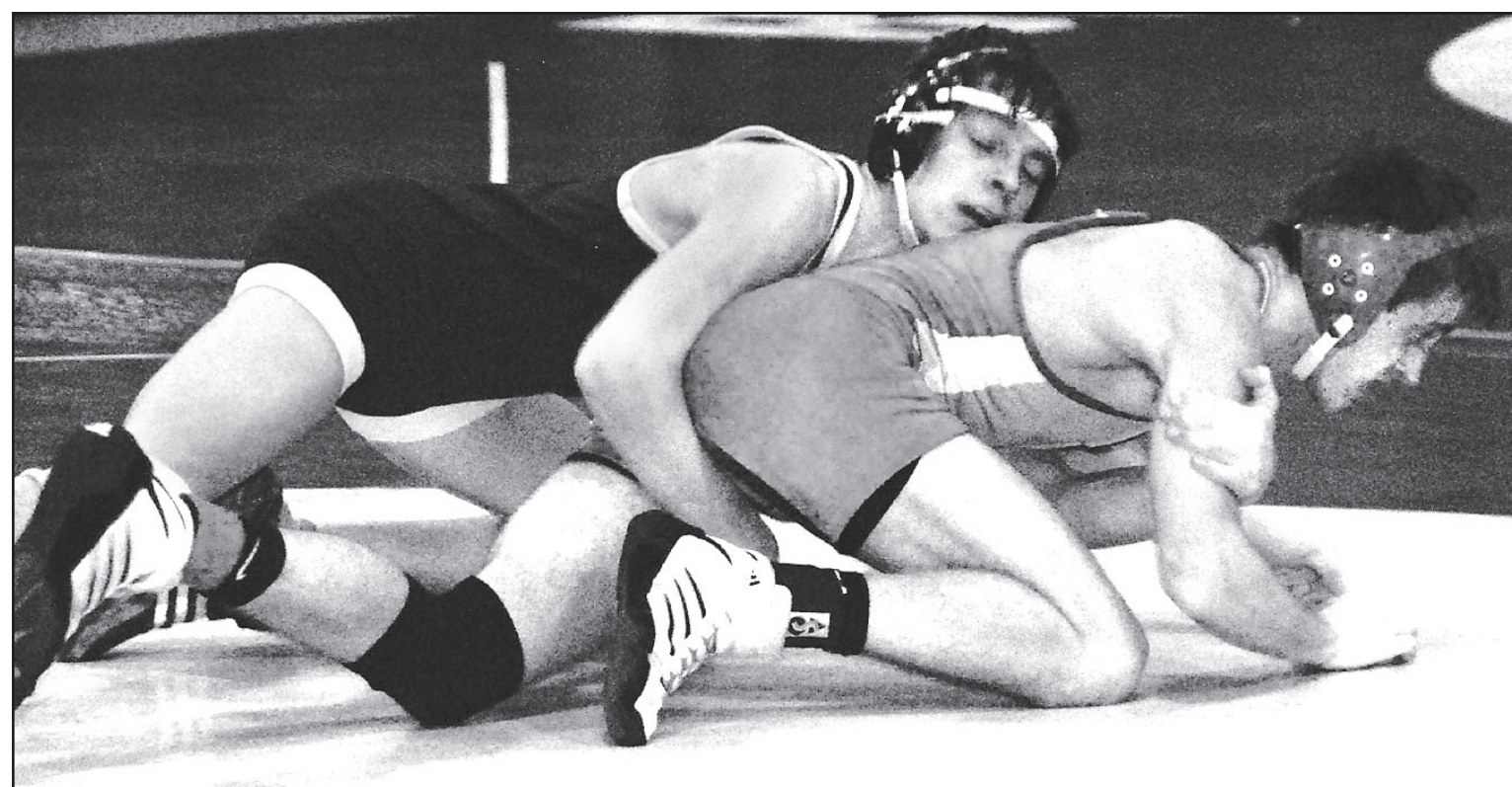
• Ashley Horton, three rebounds and a steal.

## Three wrestlers win trips to state

Three Oberlin wrestlers won berths at the state meet during competition at Norton over the weekend.

Brent Juenemann and Daniel Jordan came in third in their weights and Nolan Peters took fourth at the regional tournament to win their places at the state competition at the Gross Memorial Coliseum in Hays this weekend.

Norton won the Class 3-2-1A Regional Tournament with 218 points while Oberlin came in 12th with 61.5.

## Golden Plains downs Devil boys

The Decatur Community High School boys basketball team lost 60-53 to the Golden Plains Bulldogs on Tuesday in Oberlin.

Oberlin started out strong, outscoring Golden Plains 16-14 in the first quarter and 17-9 in the second to lead 33-23 at the half.

The Bulldogs came back in the third quarter to outscore the Red Devils 14-8 and cut Oberlin's lead to 41-37. And in the fourth quarter, the mean 'Dawgs bit hard and fast, scoring 23 points, including six free throws and three three pointers, while Oberlin posted just 12 points.

The Oberlin boys hit five three-pointers and 12 of 18 free throws for 67 percent. The Bulldogs put down 10 of 16 charity shots and six three pointers.

Scoring for Oberlin were:

• Dakota Soderlund, 18 points, including four for four at the free-throw line, two rebounds and two steals.

• Wiley Farr, 17 points including a three pointer, 10 rebounds, three assists and seven steals.

• Dalton Jones, 9 points on three three pointers, five rebounds and four assists.

• Zach May, 5 points, five rebounds and a steal.

• Keithen Fortin, 3 points on a three pointer and three assists.

• Tyler Bruggeman, 1 point, three rebounds and an assist.

The loss left Oberlin's record at 1-18.

Oberlin's junior varsity was able to edge the Bulldogs 53-51 for an overtime victory.

The boys from Rexford started out with a 14-13 lead in the first quarter and increased that in the second by outscoring Oberlin 14-10 for a 28-23 lead at the half.

In the third quarter, Oberlin cut that lead to 41-38 by outscoring the Bulldogs 15-13. In the fourth, Oberlin evened the score at 49 by outscoring Golden Plains 11-8.

Two good free throws were the difference in overtime. Oberlin made two out of four charity shots and a two-point basket while Golden Plains was only able to score a single basket.

Scoring for Oberlin were Jones, 13 including three three pointers; Kelly Stamm, 9 on three three pointers; Ryan May, who made the winning charity shots, and Tyler Shields, who made two three pointers, 8 each; Bruggeman and Conner McHugh, 6 each; Fortin, 2; and Z. May, 1.

The last regular-season game was to be on Monday against the Panthers in Phillipsburg.

Substate play will start on Monday and Tuesday and continue on Thursday, Friday and Saturday, March, 4-6. Who or where Oberlin will play wasn't known Monday.
