Oberlin teams take first

The Decatur Community High Red Devils won both the girls and boys divisions of a triangular track meet in Oberlin last Tuesday.

In the boys division, Oberlin won with 82 points followed by Quinter, 63, and Rawlins County 35. The Oberlin girls racked up 77 points, followed by Quinter, 54, and Rawlins County, 48.

Power lifters place at state meet

Five Oberlin students placed at the Class 2A State Power Lifting Meet on March 27 at WaKeeney.

Brandi Diederich and Jordan Dreher took first in all their events, while Dakota Soderlund came in first in two out of three.

Lifting for Oberlin were:

- Diederich, first in bench press, 125 pounds; clean, 150 pounds; and squat, 190 pounds for first overall.

- Dreher, tied for first in bench press, 145 pounds, a state record; first in clean, 160 pounds, also a new state record; first in squat, 210 pounds; and first overall.

- Soderlund, third in bench press, 230 pounds; first in clean, 280 pounds, and squat, 360 pounds, for second overall.

- Toby Peters, third in bench press, 225 pounds, and clean, 265 pounds, and fifth in squat, 275 pounds, for third overall.

- Keithen Fortin, third in bench press, 195 pounds, and clean, 195 pounds, and fourth in squat, 255 pounds, for fourth overall.

All Class 2A schools in the state were invited to the meet, said Joe Dreher, Decatur Community High athletic director.
