Girls come in second

The Decatur Community High women came in second in an 11-team field at the Oakley High School Invitational track meet Friday.

The Oakley Lady Plainsmen won their own meet with 136.5 points, followed by Oberlin at 128, Hoxie and Quinter with 71 each, Grainfield 43, St. Francis 32, Sharon Springs 16, Brewster 14, Triplains 7 and Golden Plains 2.

The Oberlin girls won five events at the meet and junior Jordan Dreher threw the javelin for a school record.

• Dreher, shot put, 35 feet 7 inches, and javelin, 126-10, first; 100-meter dash, 13.55 seconds, second.

Oberlin attends Plainville meet

After losing a chance to test their track and field skills in Atwood due to the weather earlier in the month, the Decatur Community High track team took the opportunity to attend the Plainville Invitational last Tuesday.

The girls came in third and the boys fifth at the nine-school meet.

Russell won the girls division with 112 points, followed by Victoria 91, Oberlin 86, WaKeeney 72, Plainville 63, Norton 57, Ellis 48, La Cross 20 and Phillipsburg 4.

The Norton Bluejays took first for the boys with 116 points, followed by Russell 102, LaCrosse 98, Victoria 70, Oberlin 66, Plainville 45, WaKeeney 30, Ellis 24 and Phillipsburg 1.

The Decatur Community High boys finished in the middle of the pack on Friday, taking fifth at the Oakley High School Invitational track meet.

Oakley won the event with 109 points, followed by Quinter with 101, St. Francis 92, Grainfield 60, Oberlin 59.6, Hoxie 56, Golden Plains 23, Sharon Springs 18.2, Brewster 16.6, Triplains 14.6 and Cheylin 8.

Oberlin came home with two individual firsts and two relay golds, as well as lots of other medal-winning places.

Finishers received 10 points for first, 8 for second, 6 for third, 4 for fourth, 2 for fifth and 1 for sixth.
