Ray Zodrow

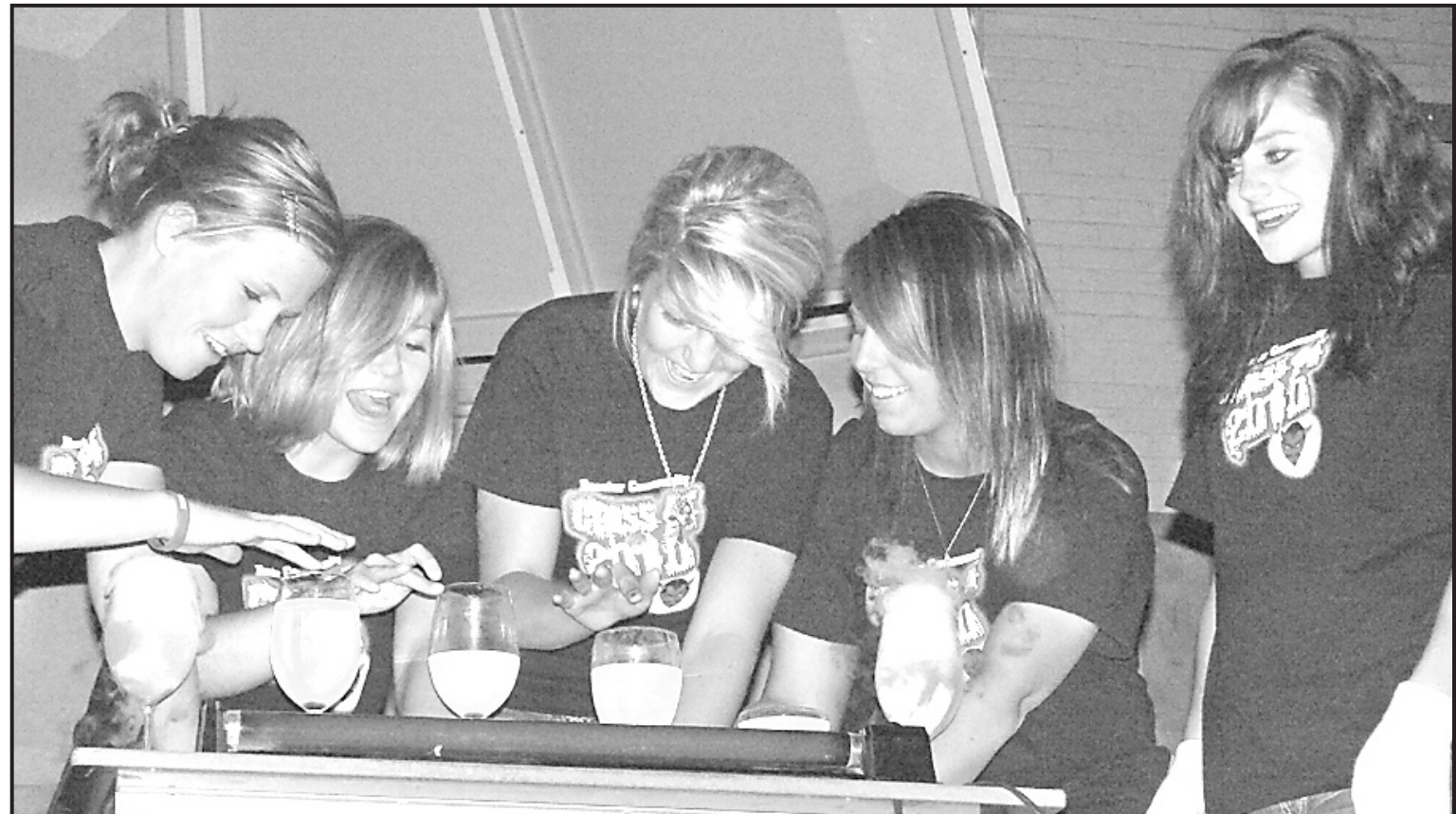
