The Decatur County sheriff's office reported these calls last week:

• On Sunday, June 20, a one-car accident was reported about four miles northeast of town on T5 Lane around 8:45 p.m. Undersheriff Alan Marcum said the fire department and ambulance also responded to the call.

Mr. Marcum said when they arrived, they didn't find anyone at the scene, so they called the victims to come back out. All of the passengers came out to the scene, but the driver Jordan Dreher, 17, was at a softball game.

Mr. Marcum said he talked with the three passengers and Miss Dreher.

Thomas Trevena of Colorado, who owns the 1999 Chevy Tahoe, got a ticket for not reporting the accident. The other passengers were Dylan and Austin Coryell of Colorado. All the passengers were 21 and older, said Mr. Marcum.

It looks like Miss Dreher lost control of the vehicle after a turn in the county road and rolled the vehicle into the south ditch. They were westbound at the time.

Mr. Marcum said the driver hadn't been drinking, but there was alcohol

in the vehicle.

The vehicle was towed to town.

• At 4:38 a.m. on Wednesday, June 16, John West, 59, of Iowa hit a cow in the road about 10 to 11 miles east of town on U.S. 36. Mr. West was driving a 2008 Kenworth truck westbound at the time. There was damage to the truck, said Mr. Marcum, possibly about \$1,000 worth.
