Outpatient drug coverage is limited for Medicare beneficiaries, so the following is important information.

Under Medicare regulations, prescription or over-the-counter drugs that are usually self-administered are NOT covered by Medicare for someone who receives outpatient services. These prescriptions include those taken orally, inhaled, applied topically and some that are injected.

The only drugs that are covered by Medicare while receiving outpatient treatment are those that are incidental to that particular outpatient treatment.

Outpatient services are treatments received in the emergency room, during hospital observation and others, such as coming in to receive an injection. This drug coverage policy applies to Medicare beneficiaries only.

As a rule of thumb, Blue Cross and Blue Shield and other commercial insurance companies cover the cost of drugs that Medicare does not. Your physician should remind

you to bring your prescription or over-the-counter medications in their original containers with you to clinic appointments or emergency room visits to avoid the much higher cost of the hospital dispensing the exact same drugs, for which the patient will have to pay. If the drug is not in its original container, hospital nurses will not be able to administer the medicine.
