

Girls win league

The Decatur Community High girls track team continued its winning ways by taking the Northwest Kansas League meet 40 points ahead of the competition on Friday in Oberlin.

The boys took third but tied on points with St. Francis, which came in second.

The Oberlin girls scored 151 points for the victory, followed by Oakley 111, Atwood 99, Hoxie 93, Quinter 76 and St. Francis 25.

It was the eighth straight first-place finish for the girls, who have won every meet so far this year.

Oakley won the boys meet with 144 points followed by St. Francis and Oberlin 113, Hoxie 111, Atwood 35 and Quinter 33.

Both of Oberlin's 4x400 and 4x800-meter relay teams came in first. Miki Dorshorst for the girls and Tyler Shields for the boys took a pair of first-place medals. Other Oberlin individual first-place finishers were Darbi Rouse, Kayla Jones, Kiah Blau and Winter Polivka.

Golfers take league

The Decatur Community High golf team won the Northwest Kansas League Tournament on Friday in Oakley and Oberlin golfer Kade Brown took first place to win the championship and set a new school record.

Brown shot 32-36 for a 68, or two under par at the Oakley Country Club course.

This is the second straight league championship for both the team and Brown.

Garrett Berry and Kelden Breth also won medals in the tournament, Berry taking fifth place and Breth ninth.

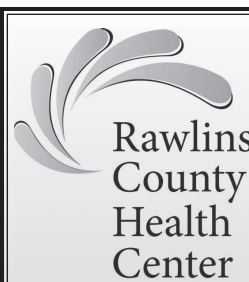
