The show was capped off with a comedy skit by Kole Breth and Kel Grafel from the sixth-grade production, "We Are Monsters."

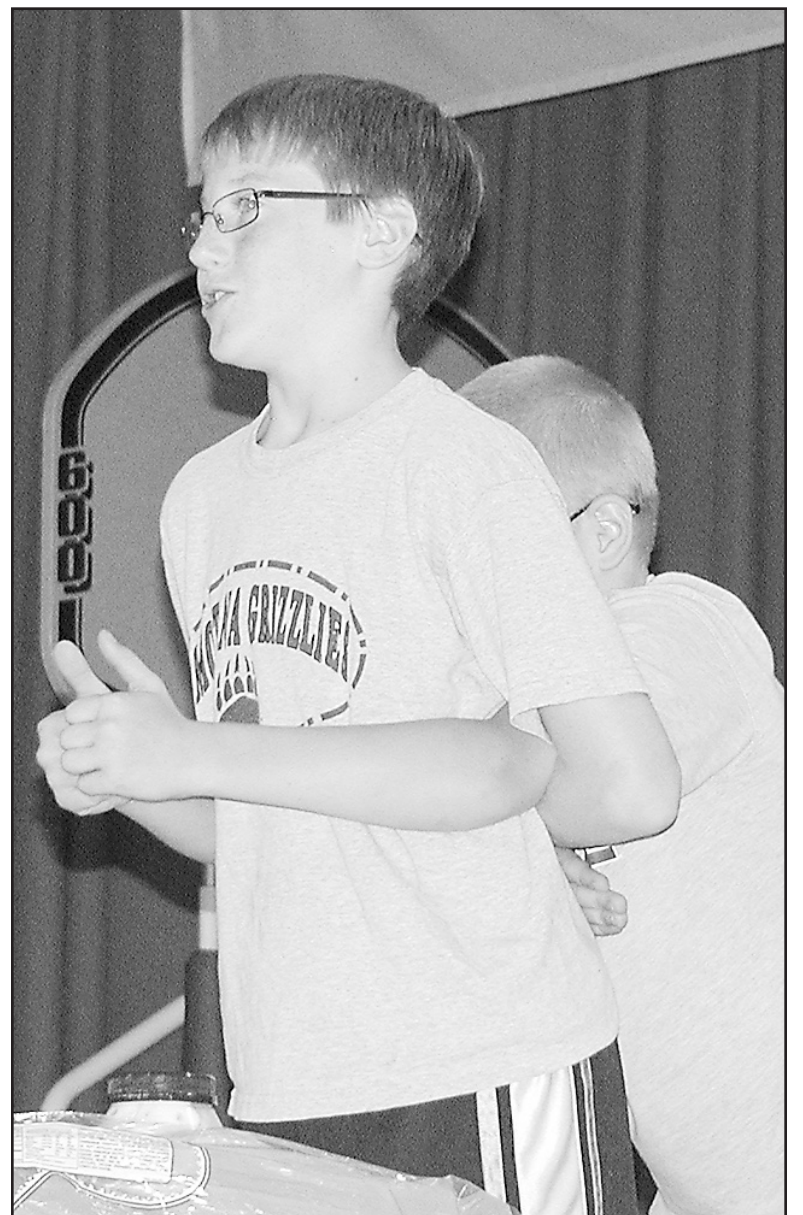
After the live show, Mrs. Tally presented a video written and directed by the sixth graders.
