## Selden show attracts cars, tractors, people

A little hot weather didn't keep hundreds of people from attending the 19th Annual Selden Antique Tractor and Classic Car Show on Sunday.

"It was hot," said one of the organizers, Judy Rogers, "but we had good weather for the day. No storms."

More than 100 entries registered for the show, she said, everything from tractors and cars to engines and a stationary baler. Other activities throughout the day included a craft show at the Selden Community Center, a pulled-pork barbecue lunch, music by Rose Bainter and her family, a kids' tractor pull, a hay-baling demonstration and a bas-

ketball free-throw contest. Special attractions included a 32-foot inflatable slide and a "Bouncy House," both provided by an area family.

The event is sponsored by the Selden Community Foundation and all profits go to help pay for community activities. Mrs. Rogers said money raised by raffle tickets will help pay for a half-mile fitness trail at the grade school.

Mrs. Rogers praised all the volunteers who helped organize the event.

"We had a lot of young people who pitched right in and helped us," she said. "Honestly, we couldn't have done it without them."
